This was done because we don't want to students in the classroom during COVID, and we weren't sure how long the budget would allows us to split for. At this point, we don't expect learning days towards the end of the year and we hope we won't have to, but it is a possiblity.

- We will need to have a meeting by November 30 to approve our budget. It was decided to do a quick zoom meeting to approve the budget.

### Coordinator's Report

1. Enrolment numbers - There are 22 students enrolled in kindergarten; 11 in each class. Verna is in on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and some Fridays. Addie and Hannah are in class all school days.

2. AISCA (Association of Independent Schools and Colleges in Alberta). We learned that an AISCA membership is only \$8.10 per student, so we became a member. They will help us with teacher certification, teacher assessments, PD days and other opportunities with our staff. They will also support us with legal issues.
