Craig Symonds Will Speak at Conference

Dr. Symonds, Professor of History at the United States Naval Academy, has taught naval history and Civil War history at the Academy for over two decades. He has wrtten several outstanding books including Stonewall of the West: Patrick Cleburne and the Civil War, Joseph E. Johnston: A Civil War Biography and his latest book History of the Battle of Gettysburg. Dr. Symonds is the only person ever to win both the Naval Acadeny's "Excellence in Teaching" and "Excellence in Research" awards.

Book Review:

Joseph E. Johnston: A Civil War Biography by Craig Symonds. General Joseph E. Johnston was in command of Confederate force at the South's first victory....Manassas in July 1861....and at its last....Bentonville in April 1865. Many of his contemporaries considered him the greatest southern commander of the war; others ranked him second only to Robert E. Lee.

But Johnston was an enigmatic man. His battlefield victories were never decisive. He failed to save Confederate forces under siege by Grant at Vicksburg, and he retreated deep into Georgia in the face of Sherman's march. His intense feud with Jefferson Davis ensured the collapse of the Confederacy's western campaign in 1864 and made Johston the focus of a political schism within the government. This is a must book to read for the conference.

Civil War Site Preservation

Developers are buying up the land where the second and third Battles of Winchester took place. At second Winchester, Gen. Robert E. Lee trapped and destroyed the Union Army under the command of General Robert Milroy. The next year on September 19 the Union Cavalry attack at third Winchester put Confederate forces on their heals.
