6. Old Business

The Board discussed purchasing a new bio-metric door lock to eliminate the need for keys. Mykola Myronowskyj will be looking into this, however this work is currently tabled as the Commissioners will be getting a new office space and Mr. Myronowskyj is working on the new command vehicle.

Joseph Scapellato reached out to vehicles for veterans to donate the old command car. As soon as the new command vehicle contracts are signed, the Board of Fire Commissioners will be donating this vehicle.

The bay door for 43-56 was damaged, this damage was caused when the garage door came down on the top of 43-56. There was no damage to 43-56. The door damage quote came to \$1,706.65. A claim is being made to the insurance company and after the deductible is paid, we received an insurance check in the amount of \$1,456.75.

During the storms in March there was damage to vehicles 43-52 and 43-55. During the conversation with the insurance adjuster regarding the door damage, the adjuster suggested that we submit insurance claims for the damage that was done. Since the fire company already paid for the repairs.

Claim checks for the above were received.

The Engine 43-52 check was in the amount of \$3,214.46.

The Brush truck 43-55 check was in the amount of \$2,195.85

7. New Business

The lease contracts for Leasing 2 were signed by and certified by the Board. The contracts will be scanned and e-mailed, then sent via overnight mail to Leasing 2.

DTA Solutions notified the Board that we are running low on QuickBooks checks. The Board approved that they will place the order for the checks. The balance should be paid as a direct withdraw from the bank account.

We wish to thank you and Chief Dennis Allonardo for your cooperation during our recent Public Protection Classification (PPC) survey. ISO has completed its analysis of the structural fire suppression delivery system provided in your community. The resulting classification is indicated above.

If you would like to know more about your community's PPC classification, or if you would like to learn about the potential effect of proposed changes to your fire suppression delivery system, please call us at the phone number listed below.

ISO's Public Protection Classification Program (PPC) plays an important role in the underwriting process at insurance companies. In fact, most U.S. insurers – including the largest ones – use PPC information as part of their decision- making when deciding what business to write, coverage's to offer or prices to charge for personal or commercial property insurance.

Each insurance company independently determines the premiums it charges its policyholders. The way an insurer uses ISO's information on public fire protection may depend on several things – the company's fire-loss experience, ratemaking methodology, underwriting guidelines, and its marketing strategy.

Through ongoing research and loss experience analysis, we identified additional differentiation in fire loss experience within our PPC program, which resulted in the revised classifications. We based the differing fire loss experience on the fire suppression capabilities of each community. The new classifications will improve the predictive value for insurers while benefiting both commercial and residential property owners. We've published the new classifications as "X" and "Y" — formerly the "9" and "8B" portion of the split classification, respectively. For example:

- A community currently graded as a split 6/9 classification will now be a split 6/6X classification; with the "6X" denoting what was formerly classified as "9."
- Similarly, a community currently graded as a split 6/8B classification will now be a split 6/6Y classification, the "6Y" denoting what was formerly classified as "8B."



- Communities graded with single "9" or "8B" classifications will remain intact.
- Properties over 5 road miles from a recognized fire station would receive a class 10.

PPC is important to communities and fire departments as well. Communities whose PPC improves may get lower insurance prices. PPC also provides fire departments with a valuable benchmark, and is used by many departments as a valuable tool when planning, budgeting and justifying fire protection improvements.

ISO appreciates the high level of cooperation extended by local officials during the entire PPC survey process. The community protection baseline information gathered by ISO is an essential foundation upon which determination of the relative level of fire protection is made using the Fire Suppression Rating Schedule.

The classification is a direct result of the information gathered, and is dependent on the resource levels devoted to fire protection in existence at the time of survey. Material changes in those resources that occur after the survey is completed may affect the classification. Although ISO maintains a pro-active process to keep baseline information as current as possible, in the event of changes please call us at 1-800-444-4554, option 2 to expedite the update activity.

ISO is the leading supplier of data and analytics for the property/casualty insurance industry. Most insurers use PPC classifications for underwriting and calculating premiums for residential, commercial and industrial properties. The PPC program is not intended to analyze all aspects of a comprehensive structural fire suppression delivery system program. It is not for purposes of determining compliance with any state or local law, nor is it for making loss prevention or life safety recommendations.

Ladies/Gentlemen:

As counsel for the Board of Fire Commissioners, District No. 4, Township of Franklin ("Lessee"), I have examined duly executed originals of the Lease-Purchase Agreement and Escrow Agreement, if applicable (the "Agreement"), between Lessee and Leasing 2, Inc. ("Lessor"), dated as of July 1, 2018, and the proceedings taken by Lessee to authorize and execute the Agreement. Based upon such examination and upon such other examination as I have deemed necessary or appropriate, I am of the opinion that:

- Lessee is a public body corporate and politic, legally existing under the laws of the State of New Jersey.
- 2. The Agreement has been duly authorized, executed and delivered by Lessee, pursuant to Constitutional, statutory and/or home rule provisions which authorize this transaction and Resolution No. 2015-03, attached as Exhibit A to the Agreement.
- 3. The Agreement is a legal, valid and binding obligation of Lessee, enforceable in accordance with its terms. In the event the Lessor obtains a judgment against Lessee in money damages, as a result of an event of default under the Agreement, Lessee will be obligated to pay such judgment.
