
Because of our meager funds we have been relying on members to help provide our everyday operating necessities. If you can help with any of the items listed below, Thank You! Please drop off at the clubroom.

this is called a soft signature. It means the buyer now has up to 6 months to complete all of their inspections, etc. So now we can start window shopping and narrow down our list of potential new buildings in the Farmington/Hills area.

After final closing, we will then have the money to purchase or lease. Luckily, we negotiated a month-to-month lease here at the Post for only \$500 a month for up to 4 months. This is for any time we may need to stay in the building past the closing date. It will be a crazy 4 months because we have to build out (customize) the new facility, find some local storage space, and physically move. We will stay here until the new place is ready. And we have lots of upcoming events prior to moving (see page 2).

Although we are not renting out our halls to the public, if any well-known friends or regular Legion members are interested, who understand the state of our building, feel free to contact Eric for rental info.

If you hear about a restaurant closing in the area, please let us know. That would be ideal for our purposes and less money to build-out. Once we find our new home, then we can make our final decisions on the items (furniture, kitchen and bar items, etc.) to be sold versus what we need to keep. Please contact Eric, Marya or Carol to let them know if you are interested in purchasing any items. And speaking of keeping some items, if anyone can share the name of a trusted local storage space with us, that would be very much appreciated.



From AARP Fraud Watch

Say what you want about Washington politics, but older Americans generally still trust many of the federal government's agencies and operations. Unfortunately crooks know this. AARP has been inundated with calls this year about scams involving someone impersonating IRS agents, Medicare officials, Social Security Admin. officers, FBI agents and other government workers. Here are some things the government does and does not do.

- -The federal government will not call you unsolicited and ask for personal information.
- -Any important communications from the federal government usually come via the US postal service. No federal government agency will initiate contact with you through social media, text or email.
- -The government will not reach out to offer you a Federal Grant. Grants require an application, and they are always for a specific purpose.
- -No government office will ask you for an upfront payment before sending you a benefit, grant or refund.
- -The government won't suspend benefits for social security or Medicare because someone stole (or they claim someone stole) your identity.
- -Federal law enforcement agents will not bully you into revealing personal information.
- -Government agencies will not take payments in gift cards, wire transfers or cryptocurrency.

RECALL ALERT

Did you buy a generator due to the power outages this year? Echo is recalling EGi2300 generators because the unit can overheat posing fire and burn hazards. The 2300 watt generators were sold online and at Home Depot from February 2020 through June 2021. Stop using the generator and contact Echo at 800-432-3246 or go to echo-usa.com for details and instructions on how to get a free repair.

It's always a good idea to register items you purchase (such as generators) via the manufacturer's included postcards or online at manufacturer's websites. This way you will be automatically notified if any recalls happen with your belongings.

Membership Eligibility







<u>Legion membership eligibility</u>. Veterans or active duty military who have served at least one day of active duty in the US Armed Forces since December 7, 1941 and have been honorably discharged or are still serving. Must present a DD-214 (DD-217, DD-256, or DD-257).

<u>Auxiliary membership eligibility</u>. 1) Relationship to veteran: Grandmother, mother, sister, daughter, granddaughter, male or female spouse, or self (for female veterans).

2) Potential member must be related to a *living* veteran by one of the relationships stated **AND** veteran is a current member of the American Legion. **OR**, potential member is related to a *deceased* veteran who served at least one day of active service during eligible time periods (Apr. 6, 1917 to Nov. 11, 1918 and any time after Dec. 7, 1941) and was honorably discharged. Deceased veteran does not have to have been a member of the American Legion.

SAL membership eligibility. 1) All male descendants adopted sons, and stepsons. 2) Potential member must be related to a *living* veteran by one of the relationships stated AND veteran is a current member of the American Legion. OR, potential member is related to a *deceased* veteran who served at least one day of active service during eligible time periods (Apr. 6, 1917 to Nov. 11, 1918 and any time after Dec. 7, 1941) and was honorably discharged. Deceased veteran does not have to have been a member of the American Legion.


