Bible School Achievements and Perspective

The Apostolic Faith Bible School is nearing the close of another term. This has certainly been a blessed time of enjoying the good things of the Lord.

The Term of 1949 has had the largest enrollment that the school has had for two years. The enrollment has been made up mostly of new people so far as being familiar with the teachings of the Apostolic Faith is concerned.

All have applied themselves to the school and have progressed in a wonderful way. There has been a representation from eight states

and Puerto Rico.

Visitors that have been in the school from time to time have commented on the splendid job the teachers have done this year. Brother Robert Girouard, who is teacher of Prophecy, has brought to all some wonderful truths concerning the past and future in prophecy. Many have stated that Brother Amos Watkins has done an outstanding job of bringing the marvelous truths of the Gospel in Doctrine class.

Brother Jacob Regier, who is the teacher of Evangelism, has enlightened the entire student body of the fact that there is a work for all to do in carrying the Gospel, whether it be in preaching or working in the local church.

Brother Paul Harbin and Sister Anna Ruth Scott have labored several hours every day in teaching piano to the largest number of students ever enrolled in this subject since we have had a Bible School. Brother Bentson Bowen, though not a minister, has proved himself to be an able worker for the Lord during this term of school. He not only has done a splendid job of teaching two classes of English, but has been very faithful in praying and carrying a burden for the spiritual part of the School.

The Music class has made great progress under the supervision of their able teacher, Sister Grace La-Munyon. The class feels that they are better equipped to sing the Gos-

pel story of Christ.

Those that have attended this term of school will never forget the untiring efforts of Brother and Sister Scott, who have been so faithful in discharging their duties as Assistant Dean and House Mother of the School. Brother Scott, with the assistance of Patsy Peterson, Eula Mae Taylor, and Ruby Peterson, has prepared the delicious meals so immensely enjoyed by everyone each day.

As we near the close of another term, all those connected with the school are sharing the same opinion—that it is very needful for the Movement to do more building before another term. All involved realize that this is going to mean the purchasing of more land. But if the Lord's work is growing, and He has proven beyond all doubt it is growing; then we that can do something about it will be held responsible if we hold back in any

Larger Chapel Needed

A larger chapel is definitely needed as the present building is

inadequate for the needs of the student body. When visitors come to the class room, the students do not have enough room to write. Not only that, but we are expecting the enrollment to be entirely too large for the building next year.

Teachers' Quarters

Teachers' quarters are needed that we might be able to have a permanent place to house the teachers and their families. We have had to rent apartments some distance from the school; therefore the teachers have not been able to be at the school as much as it needful for them to be.

Boys' Dormitory

A boys' dormitory is needed. If we had a new dormitory for the boys, the present building could be used to better accommodate the girls and would also accommodate some of the faculty.

Nursery

There is a growing need for a nursery where the children could be properly cared for during class periods when the parents are busily engaged in teaching or attending classes. Only by being in the school can one properly appreciate this need, but nevertheless it is a very pressing need.

Longer Term

I sincerely believe that we need not only to do more building but to use what we have in a longer term. We have money in buildings and equipment that should be in use a much longer period of time each year.

The Soul That Sinneth

The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly. Jn. 10:10. Had not death been pronounced upon the human race. Jesus' coming would not have been necessary. If everyone could see the great contrast between life in Christ and death outside of Christ, the plan of God would be much plainer to us all.

To further understand the scriptures, please note that God formed man out of the dust of the ground, and man became a living soul. Adam was not the possessor of immortality, but was a living soul. He had no spiritual life, therefore, he did not die a spiritual death. Neither was his soul immortal. Ezekiel 18:4 tells us, "The soul that sinneth, it shall die." Thus, we judge that no man's soul is immortal. "Incline your ear and come unto me: hear, and your soul shall live." Isa. 55:3. So God makes a provision for the saving of our souls. "Let him know, that he which converteth the sinner from the error of his way shall save a soul from death, and shall hide a multitude of sins. James 5:20.

We are constantly confronted with the teaching of eternal torment; and because this false doctrine has been used so many years as a weapon to frighten people into church joining, it is difficult to persuade them to search the scriptures with an open mind and a teachable heart. The protestant churches often boast of their protest against the old Roman Church's teaching of purgatory, idol worship, confession to men, and tradition; but have, themselves, further distorted the truth by their teaching of everlasting life for the wicked in the lake of

This teaching of error is a definite challenge to all of us who have come to the knowledge of the truth. We should not fail to teach it for fear of criticism. A

hungry-hearted world cries for the TRUTH. We may never convert the whole world to our faith and teaching, but there are many who

will receive the truth.

'The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." Rom. 6:23. And again: "I call heaven and earth to record this day against you, that I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing." Deut. 30:19. We are given the right of choice: to serve God and live, or to reject him and Life comes through Jesus Christ, and outside of Christ there is no life. To teach and believe in eternal life outside of Christ is to make His sacrifice of none effect. If life does not come through the blood of Jesus; His coming was in vain, and He died in vain. God's plan is in vain and has failed. The Bible is worthless and our preaching is to no avail.

It is high time to awake out of sleep and meet the challenge by exposing these false teachings. Though we may have neglected to stress these truths and to teach in our churches and Sunday Schools that life is in Christ, there is a greater need than ever before to

bring this truth to light.

Many have said, "This is a nonessential point of doctrine." But Life Through Christ is the most important teaching in the Bible. Therefore, it becomes very necessary to know the truth in this matter and to recognize our obligation of teaching our fellowman. Let us

assume this obligation.

The soul that sinneth, IT SHALL DIE. May it ring in our hearts; may it be taught in our Sunday Schools: may it be preached from the pulpits, and may we all see the great need of exalting the name of Jesus, the Son of God, as the way of life and truth. "For as in Adam all die, so in Christ shall all be made alive. I Cor. 15:22. We are told by the Master, "Fear not them which kill the body. but are not able to kill the soul: but

rather fear Him which is able to destroy both soul and body in hell." Matt. 10:28.

"For, behold, the day cometh that shall burn as an oven and all the proud, yea, and all that do wickedly shall be stubble: and the day that cometh shall burn them up, sayeth the Lord of hosts, that it shall leave them neither root nor branch." Mal. 4:1. This scripture alone should be convincing enough to remove doubt from our minds. It teaches us conclusively that the wicked will be destroyed completely. They shall be left neither root nor branch.

The parable of the rich man and Lazarus has long been used as a crutch to support the teaching of everlasting torment, but in reality, it is given to describe the rejection of Christ by the Jews and His turning to the Gentiles. There is nothing more repulsive than the picture given of the poor, wretched beggar at the rich man's gate begging for the things the rich man enjoyed. The dogs came and licked his sores. This pictures poverty in its worst form. But some would like us to believe that this filthy wretch represents the holy church of our Lord. SUCH A TEACH-ING IS AN INSULT TO THE CHURCH AND TO JESUS. The true church does not beg, neither is it to be compared with poverty and filth. God forbid. I can't, by stretching my imagination, see all the saints of God in Abraham's bosom.

These are just a few of the host of Bible truths that will point the way to a better understanding of God's word. May we be faithful and diligent in converting the sinner from the error of his way; teaching of Life in Christ to all who repent, and giving this solemn warning to all who reject Him: THE SOUL THAT SINNETH. IT SHALL DIE.

If others sin, you need not mention it.

Pastoral Work

In our Evangelism class it is our purpose to devote some time to the study of Pastoral Work. Pastoral work is very important. Without pastors, our churches will cease to thrive and to grow. Without pastors our evangelistic efforts will lag and fail; it will become more and more difficult to win the lost to Christ, and be almost impossible to get Christians to make spiritual growth.

There is little doubt that some of the members of this class will be called of God in the near future to fill the pulpits of pastorates. As preachers of righteousness and as ambassadors of God, we must consider some of the requirements, duties and problems of pastoral work. It is not our purpose to expose or intimidate individuals, but it is highly important that we know how to be on our guard

against the powers of the enemy. The pastor is a preacher. His first duty then is preaching. Paul spoke to a pastor (Paul's message indicates that Timothy was a pastor) in this wise, "Preach the ' Preaching, not doing 1000 other little things, is the supreme work of a pastor. I trust that we as pastors will feel a keen responsibility of preaching the WORD. Paul said that the time would come when men would not endure sound doctrine, but would heap unto themselves teachers, having itching ears. Might I ask the question, class, "Has that time come?" Indeed it has. Many people today are merely professed Christians and not really converted. The message against hand-shake, card-signing religion is out of date. The condemnation has reached to the modern formal altar-ism. I mean that an altar-religion is no better than a hand-shake religion unless it is genuine conversion.

Careless conduct has caused pastors in the past to lose a great deal of prestige. Some may not care for prestige, but we should to the extent that we desire the respect and confidence of honest citizens.

However, beware when all men speak well of you, especially since some of these men are evil-doers. Pray that we might live such lives as would befit a pastor. We probably will not be able to convert all people to our faith, but we at least can win their confidence.

When men of other faiths, especially officials and pastors, visit our services; it is wrong for us deliberately to choose a text or subject contrary to his belief and thereby intimidating him. However, it is also wrong to compromise and choose a subject to tickle his ears. Be sure to be led of God and preach the truth. When I visit other churches, I do not expect to hear Apostolic Faith doctrines but the doctrines of the church which I am visiting. They feel the same toward us; when they visit our churches, they really expect to hear Apostolic Faith doctrine. Let us preach it in the Spirit of Christ. Incidentally, to visit other churches, especially during their revival campaigns, will do no harm but will build good-feeling.

The word, pastor, originally meant shepherd. Jesus is the good shepherd. Peter referred to Him as the "shepherd and bishop of our souls." Jesus, then, is our pastor. The word, pastor, now is used to designate a preacher that is the shepherd of a group of people or congregation.

The parable of the shepherd and his 100 sheep bears a striking resemblance to our pastoral duty when some member of the flock goes astray. The shepherd left his ninety-nine sheep and sought the lost until he found it. Pastors, then, must bend their efforts to regain the backsliders.

The poorest method to use in winning the erring one back to the narrow way is to use him or his mistakes as the theme for our sermons. This method will most usually fail. Deal with such cases individually; do personal work; show him the right way in private; and deal with him in a gen-

tle charitable way. You will win his confidence; and, in that way, in most cases, you will win him back to the narrow way.

The pastor is a shepherd. He would indeed be a poor shepherd that would neglect to feed the sheep. Likewise he is a poor pastor that fails to feed the flock of God. The first responsibility of a pastor is to preach the word, to feed the people the bread of life. Yes, students, the first duty of a pastor is to see that the people are fed. Ladies and gentlemen, whenever we leave this Bible school and go our ways to pastor our churches, we will be tempted to neglect our flocks in this respect. We will have opportunity to do things other than preaching, but preaching is the supreme work of a pastor. do justice to the job of preaching, the preacher must spend much time in prayer and study. Numerous occasions will arise in which the members of your congregations will desire you to do odd jobs for them. Pastors are often used as handy-men and jack-of-all-trades. Friends, please never take the attitude you are too good to do manual labor, but you must resist doing numerous odd jobs instead of tending to your pastoral duties.

The literal shepherd binds up and heals the wounds of his sick and wounded sheep. Likewise, a pastor is duty-bound to help his flock in times of heartache, misfortune, trial and sorrow. scriptures instruct us to help those that are weak, to strengthen the feeble knees and lift up the hands that hang down. In many cases pastors have been very successful although they were not eloquent speakers. They were so faithful in their other pastoral duties: visiting the sick, praying the prayer of faith, showing kindly interest in the people and loving the members

of their congregations.

Scripture tells us that we should be ensamples of the flock. In Phillipians 2:5-8 we read, "Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus; who being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God:

DISPERSION, REPENTANCE, RESTORATION, CONVERSION, AND PROSPERITY OF ISRAEL

Deut. 30:1-10.

Verse 1. Prediction dispersion. Also see Lev. 26:33; Deut. 28:63-67.

Verse 2. The future repentance of Israel while in the dispersion.

Verse 3. The Return of the Lord. Acts 15:14-17; Amos 9:9-14. The Lord must return before the Davidic Monarchy is set up.

Verse 4. Restoration to the land of Palestine.

Jer. 23:3-8: Ezek. 37:21-25.

Isa. 11:11-12. It is to be a second restoration of Israel and Judah from the four corners of the earth.

Amos 9:14-15. It is to be a restoration permanent in its character.

Verse 6. National Conversion.

Rom. 11:26-27: Ezek. 20:33-40: Ezek. 36:24-28.

Verse 9. National Prosperity. Ezek. 36:8-11, 30.

From these studies we arrive at the conclusion that Israel is not to be fully restored to Palestine until after the second coming of Jesus. However, large numbers are in the land before the return of the Lord.

Tithing

The paying of tithes and offerings is God's plan for financing the spread of the gospel and the support of the ministers, singers, and missionaries. God gave the commandment in detail for tithing. In Lev. 27:30, 32 we read, "And ALL the tithe of the land whether of the seed of the land or of the fruit of the tree is the Lord's; it is holy unto the Lord. And concerning the tithe of the herd or of the flock, even whatsoever passeth under the rod, the tenth shall be holy unto the Lord."

The commandments of God are not optional. With every commandment God gives a reward for obedience and punishment for disobedience. Prov. 3:9, 10, "Honour the Lord with thy substance, and with the first-fruits of ALL thine increase; So shall thy barns be filled with plenty and thy presses shall burst out with new wine." Mal. 3; 10, 11, "Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it. And I will rebuke the devourer for your sakes, and he shall not destroy the fruits of your ground; neither shall your vine cast her fruit before the time in the field, saith the Lord of hosts.'

If we fail to pay a tenth we do not tithe, and therefore we rob God. Mal. 3:8, 9, "Will a man rob God? Yet ye have robbed me. But ye say, Wherein have we robbed thee? In tithes and offerings."

Offerings means sacrifice. It is something we give to the Lord after we have paid our tithes. David said he would not offer unto the Lord that which cost him nothing.

Though the law was given to the children of Israel under the law it still holds for us. Abram was the first man to pay tithes. In the seventh chapter of Hebrews we read that Abram paid tithes to Melchizedek and that Christ was made priest forever after the order of Melchizedek. In Matt. 23:23 Jesus said, "Woe unto you scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye pay tithe of mint and anise and cummin, and have omitted the weightier matters of the law, judgment, mercy, and faith; these ought ye to have done and not to leave the other undone." The Pharisees gave tithes of all they possessed but Jesus tells us in Matt. 5:20 "except your righteousness shall exceed the righteousness of the Scribes and Pharisees, ye shall in no case enter into the kingdom of heaven." Paul tells us in II Cor. 9:6, "He that soweth sparingly shall also reap sparingly and he which soweth bountifully shall reap also bountifully." Let us give much and give it willingly for the "willing and obedient shall eat the good of the land."

"My brother," said he, "what would you be willing to do for that child of yours?" The rugged mountaineer's eyes flashed. With tremendous intensity he answered, "Mister, I'd stand between that boy and hell!" "Well, my brother," quietly replied the other, "that is exactly what Jesus has done for you."

Do you want to know what salvation means — the mystery of Christ's substitution? There you have it. Let him be your Saviour.

The Rise and Fall of Nations

Perhaps the greatest prophetical document or article ever written concerning the rise and fall of nations, is recorded in the second chapter of the book of Daniel. In a very few verses, Daniel, the great prophet of God, tells us of all major world empires from his time till the coming of Christ in the clouds with power and great glory. This period of time covers approximately twenty-six hundred

To understand the second chapter of Daniel fully it is necessary to study the political aspects of some of the more powerful nations existing at this time. This study will be a good foundation for enlightment on the prophetical Image which King Nebuchadnezzar saw

in a dream.

In 625 B. C., Nabopolassar, Nebuchadnezzar's father, set up an independent Babylonian state. He had aspirations of Babylonia becoming the dominant power of that time. With the assistance of Nebuchadnezzar he overrun Jerusalem in 606 B. C. This was the beginning of what is known as the Exile of the Kingdom of Judah which was to last seventy years as a judgment of God against the Kingdom of Judah.

Nebuch a dnezzar commanded that children, skillful in all wisdom, cunning in knowledge, and understanding in science, should be taken captives from Jerusalem and placed in his palace. One of these young men was Daniel, who was later to be a great prophet of God. These young men, figured to have been from eighteen to twenty years old, were to be as wise men in the King's palace. For three years they were given instruction and the best of care. The Lord gave them knowledge and understanding and at the end of their period of instruction they were found to be ten times better in matters of wisdom than the wise men and astrologers of that realm.

About this time Nebuchadnezzar had a dream that greatly troubled him. He could not remember the dream and desired the dream and the interpretation revealed unto him. He called in all the magicians, astrologers, sorcerers, and Chaldeans, to show unto him the dream. These men claimed to be able to reveal the unknown by superstitious rites, by the stars, by communication with the dead and by devinations. They were unable to tell the king the desired information, so the command went forth to slay all the wise men of the kingdom.

The executioners came for Daniel and thus he learned of the king's dream and the wise men's inability to interpret it. Daniel then went to the King and told him that if a little time would be granted he would shew unto him the interpretation. The request was granted and Daniel immediately began praying to God for the interpretation of the dream. The secret was revealed unto Daniel in a night vision. Daniel praised God for the revelation of the secret.

Daniel went before the King and told him that no man was able to give interpretation to the dream, but God in Heaven had revealed it unto him. Daniel was very careful to give God the honor and glory.

Daniel revealed the secret to the king thus: (Dan. 2:31-33) Thou, O king, sawest, and beheld a great image. This great image, whose brightness was excellent, stood before thee; and the form thereof was terrible. This image's head was of fine gold, his breast and his arms of silver, his belly and his thighs of brass, his legs of iron, his feet part of iron and part of clay.

The dream as interpreted by Daniel and as seen with a prophetical eye, is a very important part of prophecy and of the signs of the times. By careful study of this prophetical image it can be seen that we are living in the very last days of this dispensation of

The prophetical image interpreted, is on this manner. The head of gold was the Babylonian kingdom existing at that time. The breast and arms of silver was the Medes and Persians, who under the leadership of Cyrus, gained control of the Babylonian kingdom at the feast of Belshazzar. The belly and thighs of brass was the Grecian kingdom under the leadership of Alexander the Great. The legs of iron was the great Roman Empire, later divided into the Eastern and Western Roman Empire. The feet, part of iron and part of clay are the twenty-four Nations and Republics existing before World War I. The ten toes, part of iron and part of clay are yet to exist as the ten-toed kingdom or ten king kingdom.

A closer historical study of the kingdoms represented by the image will bring a greater realization of the perfect unerring prophecy given nearly twenty-six hundred years

As has already been stated, the kingdom of Babylon, representing the head of gold, became an independent state about 625 B. C. They then took posession of Jerusalem about 606 B. C. However, it was in 605 B. C., at the defeat of an Egyptian king, that the Babylonian kingdom became the dominant power of their day. The city of Babylon is known as the greatest city that has ever existed, as far as wealth, luxury, and power is concerned. This kingdom dominated successfully until the fall of Babylon in 538 B. C.

The Medo-Persian kingdom which represents the breast and arms of silver was set up in full power in 536 B. C. The fall of Babylon and the rise of Medo-Persia came about, of course, through the will of God, but was executed by a group of Median and Persian soldiers under the able leadership of a young Persian Prince named Cyrus. The city of Babylon was supposed to be an impregnable, defensive fortress, and no doubt they would not have fallen at that time save for the drunken party given by Belshazzar. No man was on guard, but all were reveling in sin while their foes overran them. The entrance into the city was made by

turning the water of the river flowing through the city into some old lakes below the city. Thus when the water receded the soldiers went under the walls along the river bed to capture the city and kill Belshazzar. The Medo-Persian kingdom reigned successfully until the ... year 331 B. C.

During this year Greece, under the leadership of Alexander defeated the Medes and Persians and became the dominating world power. The Grecian kingdom is represented by the belly and thighs of brass. Greece was the reigning world power until a Roman general, Pompey, captured Jerusalem in 63 B. C.

Thus began the rule of the fourth great world power, the Roman Empire. The Roman Empire is known in history as perhaps the strongest and largest Empire ever to exist. The power of the Romans is represented by the legs of iron. The Roman Empire was divided into the Eastern and Western Roman Empire, thus symbolizing the legs of the image. The Roman Empire began a dissolution period around 351 A. D. From then on they faded out of the world power group.

Since the fall of the Roman Empire, no world empire has yet arisen. The image's feet of iron mixed with clay can represent the Nations and Republics existing prior to World War I. These Nations were not united as an Empire or Kingdom, but were as the feet of the image. That is to say, some of them were strong and some were weak just as the iron is strong and the clay is weak. Also the iron and clay will not mix; neither would these Nations and Republics, thus they soon entered in war against one another.

The toes of the image will represent a period of time or a kingdom yet to come. This kingdom will be made up of ten kings or nations which will rule during the very last days of this age. It is not known exactly how this ten-toed or ten-king kingdom will be set up but we read in the eighth chapter of Daniel, beginning with the seventh verse and reading through, and especially, verse twenty-four, that ten kings would arise from one beast or ten kings ruling under some form of a kingdom. This can be said to be the ten toes of the image. These kings will arise in the very last days, approximately the time the Anti-Christ rises as a king. This system of kingdom will last until the stone that was cut out without hands breaks the image by falling on the feet.

We are living today, prophetically, in the feet of the prophetical image and will soon be ushered into the toes of the image. It is very necessary that we see the day in which we live, for shortly Christ will come and the image will be broken to pieces, and those who are not ready for this destruction of world empires and the setting up of the kingdom of Christ will be lost.

In the revealing of the last of the dream, Daniel spoke thus: Thou sawest till that a stone was cut out without hands, which smote the image upon his feet that were of iron and clay, and brake them to pieces. Then was the iron, the clay, the brass, the silver, and the gold, broken to pieces together, and became like the chaff of the summer threshing floors; and the wind carried them away, that no place was found for them: and the stone that smote the image became a great mountain, and filled the whole earth.

We can plainly see in these two verses of scripture, how Christ, the stone that was cut out without hands, comes back in power and great glory and destroys the nations and kingdoms of this world, and will set up His kingdom, thus becoming as a great mountain, filling the whole earth.

What a glorious time it will be when the earthly kingdoms are broken and carried away like the chaff of the threshing floor, and Christ will set up His kingdom here on earth. In the book of Isaiah 11:6-9 we find Isaiah telling of this kingdom. "The wolf also shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid; and the calf and the young lion and the fatling together; and a little child shall lead them. They shall not hurt nor destroy in all my holy mountain: for the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the Lord, as the waters cover the sea.

As we realize the unerring accuracy in which the Lord made known the rise and fall of nations through Daniel nearly twenty-six hundred years ago it helps us to see a little more clearly how great and perfect the plan of God is. We can see more clearly how close we are to seeing the fulfillment of this prophecy and the setting up of Christ's kingdom. Our heart is filled with exaltation and praise to the Lord for the way He reveals Himself and the hope we have of reigning with Christ in His Kingdom.

Remember Your Missionaries

Prof. Borden expresses the need of missionaries in this manner, "If 10 men are carrying a log, nine of them on the little end and one on the heavy end, if you want to help which end will you lift?

If you have never seen the need of missionaries then give these statistics your careful consideration. Arabia has 50 openly professed Christians and a population of 7,000,000. If 1,000 missionaries were today to land in India each could have a parish all his own of 550 villages. Japan has one missionary to every 83,000 population. 30,000 people die every day in India that have never heard of Christ. In the heart of South America is the greatest stretch of unevangelized territory in the world.

Surely everyone would agree that there are untold numbers that have never heard of Christ, but perhaps some may think that we should concentrate our efforts on people here in the United States of America first. All I can say is that people here have better opportunities than those across the ocean.

In feeling called to mission fields I think Paul's call to Macedonia Acts 16:9-10 could be used as our example: (1) Paul was prayed up and near to the Lord so that God could speak to him. (2) His calling to Macedonia was of God. (3) Paul saw the people as they were and their real need. It wasn't a glamorous vision appealing only to the emotions. (4) Paul went (not on an adventure tour) but to help a people. (5) After Paul was certain of the will of God then immediately they started making plans to go. How much time we waste waiting for the Lord to call us four or five times! We set

around waiting for the Lord to open the way instead of being sure of the calling then starting out on faith and asking the Lord to open the way a step at a time. Some people must have a clear "cut-anddried" idea of everything before they try anything for God. After we are sure of the calling of God, in any capacity, and feel that now is the time, let us not waste time waiting for the Lord to call us again. Lives have been ruined because they were running from God and the calling He had placed on them. Paul's testimony to King Agrippa proved his obedience to God's calling. Acts 26.

The church at Jerusalem (Acts 8:14) sent two of their most capable workers. Peter and John. to Samaria as Missionaries. If we follow their example, we'll send our most talented and capable young people as missionaries. A person who has never been a soul-winner at home cannot become one simply because he changes location. This applies to any person who feels called in gospel work. If you aren't interested in seeing your own family and neighbors saved, then how can you be interested in people whom you don't know. In John 4:20 we find that it is impossible for us to love God (or people) we haven't seen; if we don't love those that we have seen.

A Missionary should, above all things, have a genuine experience in salvation and know the Bible. You can't impart to others things you do not possess.

It would be impossible for every person to be a Missionary but all should be interested in Missions.

Hudson Taylor relates an incident that shows the importance of prayer at home for those abroad. A couple were in charge of ten sta-

The Seventy Weeks of Daniel

Max Y. Pennington

Dan. 9:24-27

Before we enter the discussion of the seventy weeks of Daniel, let us first find out a little about Daniel himself. A closer study of Daniel brings out many interesting things that I believe we should know.

Daniel was born in Jerusalem (Dan. 1:3-6; 9:24) and he was of noble and perhaps royal descent (Dan. 1:3). In B. C. 606 he was carried captive into Babylon by Nebuchadnezzar. In Babylon he was educated for royal service at the court (Dan. 1:1-4) and was given the name, "Beltechazzar," by the Chaldeans. He interpreted a dream for Nebuchadnezzar, and as a result was placed as ruler over the whole province of Babylon and was made chief of the governors over all the wise men. He held this position during the entire reign of Nebuchadnezzar (Dan. 2). Under the reign of Darius, the Mede, Daniel was cast into a lions' den and was delivered by the hand of God (Dan. 6). According to Mohammedan tradition Daniel returned to Judea after the captivity and held the government of Syria. He died in Susa, and his tomb is still shown and visited today. He is mentioned by Ezekiel as a pattern of wisdom (Eze. 28:3) and of righteousness (Eze. 14:14, 20).

Now that we know a little of Daniel's life, let us proceed with our study of the seventy weeks. Daniel had been praying to God when Gabriel, the angel of God, informed him of the following seventy weeks.

"Seventy weeks are determined upon thy people and upon thy holy city, to finish the transgression, and to make an end of sins, and to make reconciliation for iniquity, and to bring in everlasting righteousness, and to seal up the vision and prophecy, and to anoint the most Holy" (v. 24).

Here Daniel is told that seventy weeks of seven years each are determined upon his people, the

Jews, and upon Jerusalem, the holy city. First, the closing of the seventieth week is to finish the transgression of the people and to make an end of sin. Secondly, it is to make reconciliation for iniquity and to bring in everlasting righteousness. Thirdly, it is to close or finish the vision of prophecy and to anoint the most holy place. We know that all of these accomplishments are yet future.

"Know therefore and understand, that from the going forth of the commandment to restore and to build Jerusalem unto the Messiah the Prince shall be seven weeks, and threescore and two weeks: the streets shall be built again, and the wall, even in troublous times" (v. 25).

Daniel is told here that it would be seven weeks and sixty two weeks from the time the commandment was given to restore and to build Jerusalem unto the time that Christ would manifest himself as "Messiah the Prince." During the first seven weeks the streets and walls were to be built.

We will find in history that Jerusalem was spoiled by the Babylonians in B. C. 605. In B. C. 587 after a siege of three years, it was taken by Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon. The walls of the city were razed and the Temple and palaces were destroyed by fire (II Ki. 25; II Chron. 36; Jer. 39). The Babylonians slew many and had no compassion upon the young or old, man or maiden. Nearly all of the inhabitants were carried captive to Babylon; and Jerusalem was left to lay deserted, a mere heap of ruins for the next fifty years.

Cyrus the Great, king of Persia, overthrew the Babylon empire, in B. C. 538. He allowed part of the Jews to return to Jerusalem under the leadership of Zerubbabel in B. C. 536. A second group left under the leadership of Ezra in B. C. 458. The last group to return to Jerusalem was led by Nehemiah in B. C. 445.

Nehemiah had secured a decree from Artaxerxes, the king of Persia, to restore Jerusalem and to build the walls, the streets, and the Temple (Neh. 2:1-8). This decree was given on March 14, 445 B. C.

We find that exactly 483 years (69 weeks of years) after this decree was given, Christ manifested himself on April 6, 32 A. D. as "Messiah the Prince" (Luke 19:

28-44).

"And after three score and two weeks shall Messiah be cut off, but not for himself: and the people of the prince that shall come shall destroy the city and the sanctuary; and the end thereof shall be with a flood, and unto the end of the war desolations are determined" (v. 26)

Gabriel has informed Daniel in this verse, that some time after the sixty-nine weeks have been fulfilled, Jesus Christ would be crucified. Then the people of the "prince that shall come" (this prince is better known as the antichrist) shall destroy the city and the sanctuary. From then on war and desolation are determined.

We know that shortly after Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem that he was cut off, or crucified. Then in A. D. 66 the Jews brought upon themselves the great siege and final destruction by an attempt to throw off the Roman control. 1,100,000 of the Jews were killed and 97,000 were taken captive after the fall of Jerusalem in A. D. 70, to Titus. After this fall Jerusalem lay for over half a century in desolation.

Since we know that the Romans destroyed the city of Jerusalem and the temple, we know that this "prince that shall come" must come from the Roman Empire. This prince is also known as: the beast, the little horn, the king of fierce countenance, and that wicked one

make it desolate, even until the consummation, and that determined shall be poured upon the desolate" (v. 27).

This "Roman prince" is to confirm a covenant for one week or seven years with the Jews. Then in the midst of the week he shall break the covenant and cause the sacrifice to cease. He will set himself up as God in the temple at Jerusalem and demand human worship, which will be an overspreading of abomination. He will make war with the saints and the people of God, and cause everyone that does not have their name written in the Lamb's Book of Life to receive the mark of the beast (Rev. 13:15-17). He shall continue in power for 42 months or 3 1/2 years (Rev. 13:5). At this time Jesus returns to the earth with his saints and angels (I Thes. 3: 13; II Thes. 1:7), and casts the beast or the antichrist into the lake of fire (Rev. 19:20).

We can deduct from the foregoing paragraphs that the sixtynine weeks are in the past and the seventieth week is yet in the future. There is a great parentheses of time between the sixty-ninth week and the seventieth week. The church age fills this gap.

We have the warning from Jesus, and we also know that at the beginning of the seventieth week the church age ceases and it will be too late to be saved. If we do not know the Christ as our saviour, we should repent and be baptized and thus be prepared for the last week.
