

First Meeting Ecumenical Women's Group

Join us in the meetinghouse basement on First Thursdays for a new Ecumenical Women's Group. We will begin meeting on the first Thursday of November — November 7, at 6:30 pm. Don't like to drive at night or in winter? No problem! This group will also have a Zoom option, so everyone can join! We'll kick off our meeting time together by exploring women and feminine imagery in the Bible. We'll be using The Women's Lectionary by Quaker Ashley M. Wilcox (and of course many different translations of the Bible!) for this study. (And no, you don't have to buy a book — all materials provided!) I hope you'll join us for a fresh take on scripture, many differing views from many different branches of faith, and lively discussion about what it means to be women of faith today. No matter what church — no matter if you have NO church — ALL are welcome. Invite your friends!

Join Us For Wild Church

Step into nature. Take a moment. Close your eyes. Breathe. Listen. Feel the air around you and the ground beneath you. Open your eyes. Observe your surround ings. The plants. The wild life. The land. Do you feel it? The life? The history? Your connection to it? Your place in it? The presence of All That Is? You are standing in a sacred place.

Wild Church returns us to nature as a spiritual practice to remind us that we are more than just a part of the human world. Contemporary life removes many of us from the natural world — perhaps especially in church. Wild Church is worship in and with the natural world and it reminds us of our interconnectedness as well as our commitment to care for all creation. If you've been hurt by church; if you've never connected to church, if you are looking for something different than the church spaces you've found, we invite you to join us in connecting with the Divine in worship and reconnecting with the sacred space of our earth and all its inhabitants.

Friends of the Wild* meets on the third Sunday of each month beginning November 17. We will meet in the shelter at Hoover Park**at 4:00 pm. Our worship will begin with this gathering and will include contemplative walks (by yourself or with others), land acknowledgements, care for creation, or simply sitting beneath a tree and contemplating this amazing place in which we live. We meet outside rain or shine, cold or sweltering — unless weather conditions have been deemed danger ous. All are welcome — and all means ALL. Our meeting site is accessible via the paved trails from the Hoover Library parking lot if you are experiencing any physical conditions that limit mobility. Questions?
