EVANGELISM TEAM AND LENT

While researching the Lenten season and evangelism I discovered that the season is a perfect time for evangelism. The very term “evangelism” means announcing the Good News. As we make a sacrifice, during Lent, we have a perfect opportunity to be an example to others and to share the Good News with our family, our co-workers, and others with whom we come in daily contact. **Fr. John Parker says**, “The inner work of evangelism: to hear the Good News afresh ourselves, and to return to Christ, intends to produce external evangelism: the sharing with others, rooted in gratitude, of the bounties given to me by God who is love.”

As a symbol of Christ’s sacrifice for us, many Christians use the 40 days before Easter as a time to give up something they really like. Some use it as a time to become more reflective on their relationship with Christ. Others may use this time to tackle a task that has been neglected or pushed back. An example of this could be starting a new habit, such as walking each day, or filling one bag of our excess “stuff” a day to share with those less fortunate. There are many creative ways to keep Christ at the forefront of our lives during Lent. As others observe what we may be doing, or not doing, we have the perfect opportunity to share the love that Christ has for all of us.

In the article, *Lent: Preparing for Spiritual Growth*, Joy Allmond describes this season of the Christian year. As one of the oldest observations in Christendom, Lenten tradition has changed over the years, but its purpose has always been the

same: self-examination and penitence, demonstrated by self-denial, in preparation for Easter.

Lent, which comes from an Anglo-Saxon word for “spring,” can be viewed as a spiritual spring cleaning: a time for taking spiritual inventory and then cleaning out everything which hinders a relationship with Christ.

Traditionally, the season of Lent begins with a sign of repentance: placing ashes mixed with oil on one’s head or forehead. This day is known as Ash Wednesday. However, we must realize that any Lenten disciplines/denials we demonstrate before God should be practiced to help us become closer to Christ and become more like Him, not to wallow in our repentance or try to gain favor or earn more love from God.

As I researched, I noticed, over and over again, that the main objective of Lent is for us to come closer to Christ. As we strive to follow our Lenten promise, we are reminded several times daily that our symbol of penitence is but a reminder of Christ’s sacrifice for us. If others notice our struggles, our window of opportunity for sharing the Good News becomes wide open.

DISCIPLESHIP: A PERSONAL JOURNEY BY DEBBIE MCCrackEN

I accepted Jesus as my Savior when I was eleven years old at vacation bible school. I vividly remember being called by the Holy Spirit to run down that aisle and receive salvation. That day, I professed my faith in Christ, believed with all my heart that He had saved me, and was baptized. I never had to worry about “going to hell” again.

*“He who believes and is baptized will be **saved**; but he who does not believe will be condemned.” Mk 16:16 “...that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life. For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.” John 3:15b,16*

And I BELIEVED in Him!

As I walked through the next several years, I always had that assurance but also had so many questions. I would read the Scriptures, go to Sunday school and church, attend youth group. Yet, as happens for us all, temptations, trials, and tragedies kept coming. *“The only temptation [or trials] that has come to you is that which everyone has [common to human life]. But you can trust God, who will not permit you to be tempted more than you can stand. But when you are tempted, he will also give you a way to escape so that you will be able to endure it.” 1 Cor 10:13*

And I BELIEVED in Him!

Finally in my twenties, the question constantly burned in my heart; “What am I missing? I'm missing something! I am DOING all the “right things” that I thought I should DO. I am trying so hard to be GOOD and loving and kind, Lord, just like your Word says for me to do. Yet I find myself in the same place, over and over again, like being on a carousel. I am exhausted from TRYING and getting no where. I know, God, there has **got to be MORE** to living for you. I want to live for YOU, but Lord, I just don't know HOW? I desperately NEED to know that “abundant life” that Jesus came to give me. Please HELP ME understand. I have come to the end of 'me', Lord. 'I AM' DONE...”

And I Believed...HIM

And it was in that outcry of broken despair in surrender in the middle of the night that the Lord began to truly come alive in me. That still, small, ever-loving voice spoke over me, “I am ALWAYS with you. I have never left you. Trust ME and not yourself. I will show you MY WAY.”

And I Believed HIM & knew...that He loved me.

Over the next few years, the Lord led me through revelation into His Truth...The Truth.

- *“**Trust the Lord with all your heart, and don't depend [rely] on your own understanding.**” Prov 3:5 “The LORD is my rock, my protection, my Savior [rescuer; deliverer]. My God is my*

*rock. **I can run to him for safety. He is my shield and my saving strength, my defender.** Ps 18:2*

- *“So it is that we are **saved by faith in Christ and not by the 'good things' we do.**” Rom 3:28*
- *“Because of HIS kindness, you have been **saved** through trusting Christ. And **even trusting is not of yourselves; it too is a gift from God.**” Eph 2:8*
- *“...no longer counting on being saved by being good enough or by obeying God's laws, but by trusting Christ to save me; for God's way of making us right with himself depends on faith—counting on Christ alone.” Phil 3:9*
- *And now just as you trusted Christ to save you, trust him, too, for each day's problems; **live in vital union with him.** Col 2:6*
- *Therefore let us **approach** the throne of God's gracious favor with confidence and without fear, so that we may **receive mercy for our failures and find His amazing grace to help in time of need.**” Heb 4:16*

So began the journey that Jesus invited us to take with Him...“**Follow ME** and become my **disciple**”. You see, legalism emphasizes what we do for God instead of what God does for us. It leads us to believe that our salvation experience, being “born again”, is the final choice...we have 'arrived'. From then on, it is “up to us” to “work out our salvation with fear and trembling” Phil 2:12. And that is exactly what I **tried** to do! But, as the light of Christ's love began revealing the truth of His Word to my heart, the same scriptures I had read before now had new meaning. Phil 2:12,13 does *not* mean work so as to earn your own salvation. The Amplified version of this verse and the following verse tells us: work out your salvation [cultivate it, actively pursue spiritual maturity] with awe-inspired fear and trembling [using serious caution and critical self-evaluation to avoid anything that might offend God or discredit the name of Christ]. 13 **For it is [not your strength, but it is] God** who is effectively **at work in you**, both to will and to work [**strengthening, energizing, and creating** in you the longing and the ability to fulfill your purpose] **for His good pleasure.**

In “following” His leading, He teaches me. In every surrender, He gives me new 'sight'. As I draw ever closer to Him, I can experience His 'rest'. It is not about “me” anymore! Hallelujah! My work in this life is focusing on “following Him”, loving Him, learning from Him, walking with Him, trusting in His plan for my life and not my own, becoming like Him...and living His abundant life, the “God-intended” life He came to give me. To Be His...disciple.

WHAT IS THE LAY LEADER

I've had someone ask me this question. This is the best and most complete explanation I've found:

What is a lay leader in the United Methodist Church?

In The **United Methodist Church** the **lay leader** refers to the principal layperson in a local church, district or Annual Conference who represents and leads the laity in ministry. It is an elected position, and the **lay leader** will serve on most church committees.

What does lay mean in religion?

Sometimes members of the laity will play a role in the service. The noun laity is from the word **lay**, and **lay** person has a similar church **meaning**. The word **lay** itself is from the Greek word laikos **meaning** "of the people."

Responsibilities of the Position

- The lay leader represents the laypeople in the congregation in working with the pastor for the mission and vision of the congregation.
- The lay leader engages in spiritual practices that build a relationship of attentiveness to God's will and direction.
- The lay leader represents the laypeople in the congregation and serves as a role model of Christian discipleship for the congregation.
- The lay leader works with the pastor and other leaders to launch or strengthen ministries that build discipleship.
- The lay leader assists in advising the church council about opportunities available and the needs expressed for a more

effective lay ministry of the church in the community.

- The lay leader plans with other leaders in the congregation for celebrating the ministry of laypeople throughout the year and especially on Laity Sunday.
- The lay leader meets regularly with the pastor to discuss the state of the church and the opportunities for ministry to advance the mission and ministry of the congregation in the community.
- The lay leader continues to study and train and to develop a growing understanding of the church's reason for existence and the types of ministry that will most effectively fulfill the church's mission and that will help strengthen the lay leader's own work.
- The lay leader informs the laity of training opportunities provided by the annual conference.
- Lay leaders are encouraged to become certified lay servants.
- The lay leader is a member of the charge conference, the church council, the staff-parish relations committee, the finance committee, the trustees, and the nominations and leadership development committee.
- Lay leaders are voting members of all the aforementioned committees. Each of these committees has specific responsibilities, but the lay leader represents the laity in each situation, as well as serving as an interpreter of the actions and programs of the annual conference and the general church. 


