### Majoring on the Minors

Have you ever heard the phrase "don't major in the minors?" Usually when someone says this they are telling you not to let the little things in life get in the way of your big plans. Good advice, right?

But this month we ARE going to major on the minors. The Minor Prophets. The Minor Prophets might be the most neglected genre of scripture in the whole Bible. Think about it, off the top of your head how many stories do you know from the Minor Prophets? If you're a good student of the Bible you might have

named Jonah. If you're really good you might have named Hosea. The others? We don't even like to pronounce their names. What's Habakkuk about? How about Amos? Zechariah? Do you know what the book of Zedekiah is about? (Trick question that's not even one of the books!)

A STUDY OF THE MINOR PROPHETS

January 29th: Habakkuk For many of us we've learned the history of Israel, we've read the prophets that point us to Jesus, we certainly have learned our New Testament, but we don't know much about the time in between. In Israel this was a time of exile and return. Israel was looking forward to the promise of being re-established as God's kingdom. Israel is in a constant state of anxiety, knowing that they have turned away from the promises of God, but still receiving hope that God will restore them in the future. In the Minor Prophets we end up with terribly depressing condemnations like:

My people are destroyed from lack of knowledge. "Because you have rejected knowledge, I also reject you as my priests; because you have ignored the law of your God, I also will ignore your children."

- Hosea 4:6

But also words of hope like this:

"The LORD your God is with you, the Mighty Warrior who saves. He will take great delight in you; in his love he will no longer rebuke you, but will rejoice over you with singing."

-Zephaniah 3:17


