A Note From Rick: Markets steady to stronger at TLA this week. Springers and fresh cows were steady for the most part with the top prices being just a little softer. Calf markets were steady to slightly stronger. Slaughter prices remained very strong for both cows and Holstein steers. We had a nice run of Holstein replacement heifers for our June special feeder sale. Several groups of good quality heifers ranging from 500 lbs to 900 lbs. The market was a little stronger than it was in May with the bulk of the cattle bring \$.85 to \$.95 per lb. Prices on all dairy cattle remain unchanged when you look at it over the last year really. Not sure what it's going to take to get a rise in this market but with slaughter cows being considerably higher and the fact that there continues to be less and less people raising heifers to sell, I would think at some point they would be a little more valuable. The big hang up is definitely milk prices. There continues to be plenty of milk out there as production continues to be very strong from farm to farm. Have a great week!
