#### "Teens Reading the Bible"

A Note from Jarryn

How many of you have a physical copy of the Bible that is a little or maybe a lot worn. Maybe your Bible is marked up, verses flagged or even whole pages, passage underlined or highlighted. Maybe your pages are dog-eared with notes down the sides or maybe you're an artist and have found that pictures speak a thousand words. Which ever best describes your Bible, you know it's been used. But for most teens, their Bibles look a little different. I actually read about this in a article the other day which has odd timing since we have been discussing in youth group how the Bible has something for everyone!

A recent Barna survey revealed that most youth today brand the Bible as boring, confusing, and a source of guilt. For those of us that have spent time in the Bible we know one thing for sure the Bible is far from boring. Now don't get me wrong there are some books that are a whole lot less exciting unless you like genealogy or learning about the rules for the priests, and some people do. To combat what the Barna group found, the article had some tips for us when talking about the Bible.

The first was to frame it as the story of God not just a book of recipes. What they mean is when we read or teach a story from the Bible make it come alive, be a storyteller. Don't just read a story but make sure they know the tone and context of the story.

Secondly invite fearless conversation, don't just assume they understand the story or know what is going on. Even I have found, after stopping them in the middle of a story, that sometimes there has been so many words they have lost what is going on. Ask them questions and not just yes or no questions, invite question or comments.

Lastly, look at the irresistible Jesus. The story of the Bible leads to one person, Jesus Christ and what he did for us. The whole goal of reading the Bible in youth ministry is to show that Jesus is at the center of the whole Bible. The Old Testament points to him and the New Testament shows Him, and shows what our life looks like when we are guided by Him.

Our goal is to get the youth to look at the Bible and see more then just words that are confusing or boring, but to get them to see that the Bible is full of amazing stories that show us Christ and that God always has a plan for you and me. Lead them to WANT to read more. Thank You,
