The Consolations of the Holy Spirit

The Prayer to the Holy Spirit that we pray so often as a part of our Emmaus activities is a deeply meaningful and important prayer. It centers us on the essential fact about Emmaus that we are dependent upon the Spirit of God working in and through all that we do for the results we all desire to come from our efforts. It is not our efforts but the work of the Holy Spirit that effects the lives of the pilgrims on the walks. We pray the prayer so often because we know that this is true.

It is deeply meaningful to me and I trust to each of you because it voices our deepest needs: - the kindling is us of the fire of the love of God.

- that we be continually recreated.
- that we might have God's divine wisdom in our living.
- that we be blessed to receive the benefits of God's spirit alive and working in our lives.

The use of the word "consolations" in the next to the last sentence is a beautiful usage of words. "The Consolations of the Holy Spirit" are what in other places are called the fruits and the gifts of the Holy Spirit:

Fruits: the qualities of character and spirit that God's Spirit gives to those whose lives are open to being shaped by His work within their inner selves. Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control.

Gifts: Those abilities to serve His purposes that the Spirit of God gives to those who are open to being directed by His work within them. These gifts are unique to each individual but they are all given to the end that God's purposes might be accomplished.

The use of the word "consolations" to describe the blessings of the work of the Spirit reaches back into the rich history of Christian spirituality. It is the word used in this regard in the ancient monastic tradition. It is a rich, beautiful word to use to describe this essential part of our relationship to the Lord.

I trust that each time you pray The Prayer to the Holy Spirit personally and each time that we pray it together you are praying from the depth of your soul.

Testimony from a recent pilgrim

What did my "Walk to Emmaus" mean to me? How can I describe it when I still can't quite believe it? I can't believe someone cared enough to invite me, provide what I needed to get me there, including transportation and a meal on the way. I can't believe that person would stay there and pray for me after getting me there. I can't believe he would arrange for letters from loved ones, acquaintances, and even people I didn't know. I can't believe that person would return for a candlelight service later that week,

I can't believe all the godly volunteers that spent countless hours preparing, praying, presenting, supporting, and loving; before, during, and after the Walk. I can't believe that many people working together for three full days, without a negative word (at least within earshot of the pilgrims). I can't believe I'm still so excited about an organization that I had not even heard of until a few months before my Walk. I can't believe anyone would turn down the opportunity to attend a Walk to Emmaus if they would see the difference it could make in their life.

I can't believe it has been almost a year since my Walk, and I am still as excited about it as I was the night of our candlelight ceremony. I can't believe I have not yet volunteered to serve during a Walk. I believe I'll do that now.



Dear Aunt Emma.

I am a little confused about Emmaus, Chrysalis, Young Adult Chrysalis, Epiphany, and Kairos. I thought I saw a Chrysalis Butterfly working in the Emmaus Conference Room. Are you familiar with them? B.R.

Dear B.R. Yes, and there is also Cursillo, Tres Dias, Via de Cristo, and maybe others that I have not heard about, all of which are various denominational ministries similar to Emmaus. But the ones you mentioned in your question I am aware of, having worked in or attended some of their functions.

Emmaus is ecumenical and is under the jurisdiction, operation and control of The Upper Room of the United Methodist Church. As you recall, the first Emmaus Walks were called "The Upper Room Cursillos" as the "Walks" were spinoffs from and with the permission of the Roman Catholic Cursillos (or Cursillo de Christionstad - Short Course in Christianity). Emmaus is normally for persons over 21 years of age with separate 3 day Walks for men and women.

The Central Alabama Emmaus Community has been in existence since May, 1993.and is under the direct supervision and control of the Board of Directors of the CAEC. Persons having attended a Walk to Emmaus are referred to as "Pilgrims."

Young Adult Chrysalis (YAC) is under the direct supervision of the Central Alabama Chrysalis Community and exists under its parent organization, the Central Alabama Emmaus Community. Their 3 day event is called "Journey" and is for young adults, age 18 - 24, college age or young career, and YAC is a new ministry in Central Alabama. Those completing the 3 day event are called "Butterflies". Chrysalis is for high school age youth , 15 - 18. This is also a 3 day event and those youth who have completed this ministry are also called "Butterflies". Their 3 day event is called a "Flight", and is also under the direct supervision of the Central Alabama Chrysalis Community and exists under its parent organization, The Central Alabama Emmaus Community. Please note that YAC and Chrysalis Butterflies "are eligible to serve on the Support Committees of a Walk (to Emmaus). Once Chrysalis Butterflies reach the age of 18, they are eligible to be considered for an Emmaus Conference Room team member." (p. 148, The Upper Room Handbook on Emmaus). Although Butterflies should be sponsored and encouraged, but not required, to experience the Emmaus Walk, before participating in the adult Emmaus event.

Epiphany is a ministry for youth offenders and is held quarterly somewhere within the State of Alabama in state run Correctional Facilities for Youth. The graduates are called "Stars". Kairos is held in prisons for adult inmates. All have different talks, different formats, different procedures, etc.,with each ministry developed to reach that particular age group or category.

But all have that one golden thread running through it. developing Christian leadership
