## SOFTBALL PLAYER PROFILE: DAN MELOSI -Larry Wolfe

A Detroit native, Dan Melosi graduated from Notre Dame High, a Catholic all-boys school in suburban Harper Woods. However, that isn't as bad as it sounds since the all-girls Regina High was right next door! Dan played on the baseball, basketball and football teams and played the trumpet in the Fightin' Irish band, but baseball was his "main game."

Dan earned a BS in Business Administration at Central Michigan University and later an MBA from Western International University. Shortly after graduating from CMU, Dan decided to "skip out" on Michigan's winter weather and accepted a position as Dormitory Hall Director at ASU in Tempe.
