Cooked Playdough Recipe

- 2 cups white flour
- 1 cup salt
- 2 Tbsp cream of tartar
- 2 cups of water
- 1 Tbsp vegetable oil
- food colouring

Combine and cook ingredients over medium heat. Turn out onto counter and knead until smooth. Store in an airtight container.

Please make 2 separate batches to ensure enough for preschool use. Thank you!
