Lutheran World Service by Walthagaye Leavitt

LWS or Lutheran World Service is an international, non-governmental organization that focuses on sustainable development projects, disaster relief and recovery projects. It was founded in 1945 to collect and send aid to people living in post-world war II Europe. Today, LWR helps communities living in extreme poverty, adapt to the challenges that threaten their livelihoods and well-being and responds to emergencies with a long-term view.

In 2023, LWR collected 551,700 quilts and kits (health or school kits) from people around the United States and sent them on to 14 counties in need. Carson City Lutheran church made 263 of those.

The Carson City Lutheran church usually meets on the last Friday of the month and puts quilts together. One is able to attend for as long or as little as wanted to put them together. They are then tied and sewn. There are jobs for anyone whether you can sew or not. One can stand or sit to tie. Or just come and join in the fellowship.

Donations of time or material are always welcome. We use sheets for backings, but they must be cotton. So, as you garage sale this year, we take fabric, batting, sheets, blankets, mattress pads, heavy crochet thread, or sewing supplies.

## IM 3<sup>rd</sup> meal by WalthaGaye Leavitt

Food Insecure children are on the rise and more schools are partnering with IM 3<sup>rd</sup> meal to help their children. On a daily basis, almost 900 bag lunches are made. They are always in need of snack materials like raisins, cereals, nuts, dried fruits, or pretzels. Money can be used. They buy from Feeding America where they can buy more food for little money.

Volunteers are always needed to do an assortment of jobs. One can sit or stand for most of the jobs. Once again, come see what is happening or come n donate a couple of hours on a weekday or night to put a meal together for the children of lonia and Montcalm County.

Volunteering is the best drug for loneliness, depression, and prevention of other ailments.

#### START YOUR SPRING GARDEN NOW

It may be too early to start gardening out of doors, but April is a great time to begin planning or perhaps even planting a few seeds while you wait for the weather to warm up. Gardening catalogs have already arrived, and seed packets are available in various stores. If you are new to gardening, and a little bit intimidated, don't let that stop you from trying. The most experienced gardeners will tell you that at the best of times, gardening can be both challenging and rewarding, so let the adventure

begin.

You don't need a greenhouse to start a few seedlings. A sunny windowsill, small pots or growing trays, a little starting soil, seeds, water, and you're good to go. Seed packets tell you how to plant them, and gardening centers are happy to direct you to a good growing medium. If you don't want to start from scratch, small plants are available in gardening stores and even in some supermarkets. This year, the Flat River Community Library in Greenville is offering a seed library. Seed packets of both flowers and vegetables are on offer. Patrons can request up to five varieties per visit, with a total of 15 packets per season. The season lasts until they run out of packets. If you'd care to help this program along, they will accept donations of unopened commercial seed packets. Nurturing a plant, watching it grow and flourish, is very rewarding.

If you want an outdoor garden, but have limited space, or have trouble bending down to garden, consider raised beds or stand planters. A lot can be grown in very small spaces, you don't necessarily need a huge space to grow a few veggies, and you can even intersperse some flowers along with your edibles. In fact some flowers help keep garden pests away. The colorful Marigold has a strong odor, and they are good for repelling plant lice, mosquitoes and even rabbits. Chrysanthemums and Rosemary deter a number of bugs. Garlic is another good repellant, and you can use it in cooking too!

Don't be afraid to ask a gardener friend for help. Gardeners are typically an enthusiastic lot, who love to share their knowledge with others. If you want to start up a conversation with a gardener, just compliment them on their garden and they'll probably happily bend your ear and answer any questions you might have. You can also attend the free "Ask A Gardener" program on Thursday, April 18<sup>th</sup> at 6:30pm at the Flat River Library. This is an annual event held by members of the Greenville Garden Club who have lots of wonderful knowledge to share.

If you are a beginning gardener, don't try to do too much all at once, or you might become discouraged. Choose easy to grow flowers and two or three easy to grow veggies to start. Gardening is an adventure to be enjoyed, so plan to start now.
