- \$38,131,840 General Operating Budget
 - Actual \$31,131,840
- Per Pupil Avg. Cost: \$15,354 in FY16-17 (12th Least Funded in NJ)
 - \$20,849 FY16-17 NJ Per Pupil Avg. Cost
 - FY17-18 Adequacy Gap Per Pupil: \$(883)

How Do We Fix Our Issues?

- Foresight of previous Boards of Education and Administration
- Original Plan: Roosevelt Expansion Project
 - 11 Classrooms for \$9,000,000 (15,782 sq. ft)
- Queen of Peace Becomes Available: 7/1/17
- Negotiations to Purchase Queen of Peace Begin
 - Approximately 32 Classrooms, Gym, Field & Parking Lot for \$6,400,000 (72,160 sq. ft./3.68 acres)
 - 26% off Fair Market Value: \$8,659,000





Phase 1

Purchase Queen of Peace High School

- LRFP Amendment Approved by NJDOE (10/22/18)
- Land Acquisition Approved by County (12/5/18)

Immediate Impact on Schools 2020-2021 School Year

- Reestablish Neighborhood Schools
- Another gymnasium for recreation and communitybased events
- Another field for recreation and community-based events
- Space to create year-round batting cages
- Acquire wrestling/cheer facility

Question 3 (PreK4)

Immediate Impact on Schools (Tentative)
2020-2021 School Year

- Establish PreK 4 Program
 - Locations TBD
 - SACC Update
- Approximately 8 classrooms still remain throughout all 4 Elementary Schools to grow the Special Education program and offer more space for the following programs: OT/PT, Resource, ELL, BSI, Art & Music, and World Languages.





Phase 3

December 2019 Referendum

Approximately \$9 per month

- Boiler and Roof for new NAMS
- Furniture Upgrades for new NAMS
- Aesthetic Upgrades for new NAMS
- "Mantraps" for all Schools
- HVAC in Roosevelt and Washington School Gyms
- Jefferson Gymnasium
