Homecoming Sunday 2018 Preview

As usual, Homecoming Sunday is scheduled for the first Sunday of October which, this year, is October 7.

We will be combining our 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. worship gatherings into a single 10:00 a.m. service, so we will have elements of both services including the choir and worship band. Worship will be followed by a fellowship lunch in the fellowship hall and under the big outdoor tent.

This year's speaker is the Reverend Doctor Jeffrey Sholar (pictured right). Jeffrey was a part of our First Baptist Church family when he began his ministry career here as our Pastor to Students. Those were some of our church's best years of student ministry, and he had a powerful and lasting impact on our students.

Since then Dr. Sholar has been on the mission field, and in the pastorate. He currently serves as pastor of Cedar Falls Baptist Church.

Jeffrey and his wife, Amanda, have a daughter, Isabella, and a son, Wells. When he has time, he enjoys surf fishing and other sports.



We've asked Dr. Sholar to share with us that Sunday some of the impact that our church had on his spiritual journey, and on being an effective Christian parent in this age of cell phones and Snapchat.

Homecoming is not a "self-centered" church activity. It's not where we congratulate ourselves on being a great church. Homecoming is an opportunity for us to tell our community about what God is doing here, and how much we would love to include them in the joy and encouragement of our fellowship as we share God's love.

So who will you invite to join you at Homecoming this year?

It is our tradition to pick a special project to focus on at Homecoming and to invite our people to give beyond the tithe, beyond their regular church budget gift, to help us accomplish something more than what we normally could.


Friendship Men's Outreach

Urgent Needs

Right now, our church has **two urgent priorities** in our giving. The Stewardship Committee is asking all of us to unite behind these two top priorities with single-minded commitment.

The first of these is, as always, our church's ministry budget. Without the ministries of our church, and without the ongoing resources of study materials, lights, heating and cooling, ministries to children, teenagers, and adults, we really have no reason to exist. Without these, we don't have a church; we only have a museum that will soon be closed. God has called us to life-changing ministry, which is what our budget helps us accomplish.

The second urgent priority is the repair of our steeple. The picture below shows the rotted wood of the steeple. This damage is allowing large amounts of water to flow into our balcony area every time it rains. The building that previous generations have provided for us is being repeatedly damaged by this hole in the roof that the damaged steeple creates.



If this were our home, we would still pay the mortgage, pay the electric bill, water and sewer, buy food for the family, school supplies, pay doctor bills, etc. But beyond these essentials, we would focus on repairing our roof with urgency.

So that is what we are inviting our whole church family to do. Let's make sure the ministries that are our reason for existing are fully funded, and then, in appreciation for those who have gone before us, but even more in commitment to the Lord, let's tackle this repair project.

The estimate we have received is good for a limited time, so let's take care of this need soon to avoid an increase in repair costs!
