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MINUTES OF THE HBPOA MEETING, wanted questions from the audience as they October 5, 2017, Coast Guard Station

The monthly meeting of the HBPOA was called to order at 7:05 PM by Gladys Moore, President, who proceeded to lead those present in the Pledge of Allegiance. Subsequently, the meeting was turned over to Kathy Frase who introduced our guest speaker for the evening, Will Van Gelder of the Southwest Florida Water Management District.

Mr. Van Gelder began his presentation with some background information on his education, which was noteworthy, and also made the point early on that he is very interested in preservation of our water resources. He stated that he currently manages upland water systems after having worked with wetlands in the past and emphasized that good healthy upland systems are instrumental in maintaining healthy wetlands which are crucial, not only for the health of our coastal communities and maintaining our natural resources but also for economic growth and health of our communities and state. Before getting into his actual presentation, he emphasized that he

arose because he was there to serve us, not the opposite.

He mentioned the challenges/difficulties that have been placed on the state's resources including the water management by the fires which preceded the hurricanes that hit our state, wreaking havoc in many areas of our state. It was interesting to hear that there are 5 district lands set aside all over the state which in essence serve as biological filtration systems, thus helping to maintain the health of our water resources. Another salient point was the mission of the water management districts: 1) To protect water resources; 2) To minimize flood risk; and 3) To insure that public water needs are met. Their responsibility for water quality, water quantity and natural system protection is taken very seriously.

It was truly fascinating to become informed about the practice of prescribed burning by the water district with a target of 40,000 acres per year which can vary widely depending upon the incidence of wild fires in any given year. The purpose and benefit of such controlled burning is to (Continued on page 6)

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
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CHRISTMAS BOAT PARADE

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WEEKI WACHEE ROGERS PARK LID IMPLEMENTATION

This project will improve water quality in the Weeki Wachee River.

Project Overview

The Southwest Florida Water Management District and Hernando County will be making enhancements to stormwater management at Rogers Park. The park is owned by the County and located on the Weeki Wachee River. These improvements will benefit the river by reducing the amount of sediments and nutrients entering the river.

Project Details


This project uses Low Impact Development (LID) techniques to treat stormwater runoff from approximately 1.8 acres. The LID practices being applied at Rogers Park include porous asphalt in the parking spaces, infiltration trenches and bioretention with wetland vegetation. LID techniques reduce the amount of stormwater through decreasing impervious surface area. They also improve water quality by redirecting stormwater to treatment areas.

Project Partners

This project is cooperatively funded by the District and Hernando County.

Project Timeline

Construction for this project is scheduled to begin in the fall of 2017 and will take up to four months to complete. The park will be closed during construction.

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

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
