HAMPTON TOWNSHIP RESOLUTION CONDEMNING HATE CRIMES IN THE TOWNSHIP OF HAMPTON, COUNTY OF SUSSEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, Hampton Township has been a community primarily untarnished by the type of blatant prejudice that recently occurred in our municipality when an individual vandalized a residence seemingly based on the family’s religious beliefs and political positions, and;

WHEREAS, the Hampton Township residence was targeted on two separate occasions by a perpetrator who painted a vile racist symbol on the home and vandalized political campaign signs located on the front lawn, and;

WHEREAS, that the Township Committee denounces the hateful expression of religious or political intolerance against individuals and/or their private property, and;

WHEREAS, the Hampton Township Committee celebrates diversity in the community and promotes the co-existence of those who do not share the same heritage, and;

WHEREAS, the Hampton Township Committee encourages residents to remain open-minded and tolerant of those who have differing viewpoints and cultural backgrounds, and;

WHEREAS, the Hampton Township Committee believes that a harmonious community depends on the willingness of its residents to practice mutual respect, decency, and restraint, and;

WHEREAS, the Hampton Township Committee strives to ensure the safety of all its residents against violence and aggression.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Hampton Township Committee condemns any and all actions taken by an individual for the purpose of humiliating, degrading, or harming another person based on differing religious beliefs, ethnicity, or political opinions, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Hampton Township Committee encourages residents who witness a crime, or have knowledge of a crime, to contact the New Jersey State Police immediately in order to maintain a safe and serene community, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the New Jersey State Police have agreed to notify the Township Administrator and/or the Township Committee in the event that another hate crime occurs in our community to afford township officials the opportunity to respond accordingly and address concerns of area residents.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of the this Resolution be distributed to Governor Phil Murphy, State Senator Steven V. Oroho(24th District) , State Assemblyman Parker Space (24th District) , State Assemblyman Harold J. Wirths (24th District), U.S. Representative Josh Gottheimer (5th Congressional District), Sussex County Sheriff Michael Strada, the New Jersey State Police, the Sussex County Board of Chosen Freeholders, and all Sussex County Municipalities.

HAMPTON TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE #2018-21 – A FULLY FUNDED ORDINANCE TO SPEND \$22,000.00 FROM THE RESERVE FOR RECREATION IMPROVEMENTS AND \$9,718.00 FROM THE RESERVE FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO PARKS LOCATED WITHIN THE GENERAL CAPITAL FUND FOR THE EXCAVATION AND RESTORATION OF THE PLAYGROUND

Committeeman S. MacKenzie explained that the expenditure proposed in Ordinance 2018-21 could potentially deplete the reserve fund allocated for Township Recreation purposes. The original quote to complete playground improvements expired. The new quote reflects an unanticipated and substantial increase in the overall cost of the project. Committeeman S. MacKenzie suggested forwarding the issue to the Township Recreation Committee for review before the Township Committee acts on this matter.

Committeeman K. Gourlay expressed concerns about certain problems associated with rubber mulch. Mayor P. Yetter noted that the cost of rubber mulch is significantly higher than other types of mulch.

Township Administrator J. Caruso stated that the Township DPW excavated the playground area and installed all of the necessary drainage. The final phase involves laying the base fabric and placing the mulch.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman S. MacKenzie and seconded by Committeeman T. Dooley, with all members in favor, to table the introduction of Ordinance 2018-21 and forward it to the Township Recreation Committee for further discussion.


WHEREAS, the Township has received an offer to purchase the personal property for the price of \$2,000.00, which is within the range of estimated value for that personal property;

HAMPTON TOWNSHIP FIRE AND RESCUE UPDATE

HTVFR Assistant Chief D. Gunderman reported that HTVFR responded to 16 fire calls during the month of October and 206-fire calls year-to-date. He also reported that HTVFR EMS responded by 34 calls during the month of October and 238 calls year-to-date.

Assistant Chief D. Gunderman reported that the Fire Department is replacing the Department's Jaws of Life apparatus. The new equipment will be delivered in the coming weeks.

The HTVFR Annual Christmas Tree, Wreath and Grave Blanket Sale will begin November 23, 2018, the day after Thanksgiving.

HTVFR was awarded Second Place at the Sussex County Firemen's Parade recently held in the Borough of Ogdensburg. First Place went to the Ogdensburg Fire Department.

Committeeman K. Gourlay thanked HTVFR Members for organizing a successful Spaghetti Dinner Fundraiser. The proceeds went towards assisting two HTVFR Members, who are battling illnesses.

PUBLIC SESSION

Township resident Ms. J. Giovanetti thanked Committeeman T. Dooley for attending two local rallies recently held in response to a hate crime that occurred in Hampton Township. Ms. Giovanetti explained that both events were well attended and helped to bring the community together in a positive way.

Ms. J. Giovanetti and Ms. K. Rotondi expressed their appreciation to the Township Committee for responding to the crime by adopting, "Hampton Township Resolution Condemning Hate Crimes in Hampton Township" earlier in the meeting.

Mayor P. Yetter noted that several Township Committee members were out of town the weekend of the rally and could not attend. The second rally took place during the workweek, making attendance difficult. He thanked Committee T. Dooley for representing the Township Committee at both events.






