JANUARY 30, 2018**

FLAG SALUTE: Mayor Philip Yetter led the Flag Salute at 7:00 P.M.

ROLL CALL: Present: Committeeman Timothy Dooley, Committeeman Keith Gourlay, Committeeman David Hansen, and Mayor Philip Yetter. **Also Present:** Administrator Eileen Klose and Township Attorney Frank McGovern.

APPROVAL OF THE CONSENT AGENDA

A MOTION was made by Committeeman K. Gourlay and seconded by Committeeman D. Hansen, with all members in favor, to approve the Consent Agenda as listed above.

REGULAR AGENDA

JCP&L Representative Ms. J. Espinoza presented information regarding a career program offered to young adults through JCP&L. After completing the program, students will receive a Degree and become viable JCP&L job applicants.

At the suggestion of Township Administrator E. Klose, Ms. Espinoza stated that she would provide an information packet about the program to Hampton Township Fire and Rescue, Inc. for their member's to review and consider.

Ms. Espinoza stated that the Sussex County League of Municipalities scheduled a meeting on March 15, 2018 at 6:00 P.M. at the Mohawk House. The topic of discussion will be the opioid crisis facing our area. A panel of experts will be on hand to answer questions. The League is hoping to have two representatives from each town attend. Committeeman K. Gourlay agreed to go providing it does not conflict with his monthly County PAC Meeting schedule.

PAULINSKILL WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT

River Restoration Manager for the Nature Conservancy, Ms. B. Styler Barry gave an update on a restoration project at Hyper Humus . She stated that the first phase of the project consisted of soil and water studies, which were recently completed. Summaries, which can be reviewed in full at the Nature Conservancy Office located in Chester, NJ, were distributed to township officials for review.

The next phase involves the receipt and review of several Requests for Proposals from design firms to create a restoration plan. The Conservancy anticipates receiving at least three plans for consideration. Organizers of the project have reached out to several organizations, e.g., Sussex County Birders, NJ Federation of Sportsmen, and Ducks Unlimited to obtain feedback and ascertain the types of recreational activities people would like see in the newly restored area.

Committeeman D. Hansen asked whether the area is going to be used for passive or active recreation. Ms. Styler Barry stated that the Nature Conservancy is considering all options at this point. The designers will consider feasibility and cost when determining which activities are the most suitable. Feedback from the community is an essential part of the process, therefore, Ms. Styler Barry encouraged people to contact her office with questions and/or comments.


WHEREAS, the additional balance of \$2,848.69 will be credited to the current taxes.

BOW HUNTING ON TOWNSHIP-OWNED PROPERTY

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman K. Gourlay, with all members in favor, to prohibit hunting on property owned by Hampton Township Fire & Rescue, Inc. and to post No Hunting signs.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman T. Dooley, with all members in favor, to amend the Township Ordinance to prohibit hunting of any kind on township-owned properties, vacant or otherwise.

HAMPTON TOWNSHIP FIRE PREVENTION ORDINANCE

A MOTION was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman K. Gourlay, with all members in favor, for Township Attorney F. McGovern to review Hampton Township's Fire Prevention Ordinance to ensure that it is consistent with the policies of Hampton Township Fire & Rescue, Inc.

TOWNSHIP PUBLIC WORKS EMPLOYEE JAMES WELCH

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that James Welch was appointed to the position of Assistant Foreman on a temporary basis, which is a working-class title. She explained that Township DPW Manager D. Bayles requested that the Township Committee consider appointing Mr. Welch to the position of Deputy Municipal Department Head based on his exemplary work performance.

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that if the Township Committee made a determination to appoint Mr. Welch to the new position, she would recommend that he take a leave of absence from his Civil Service classified title of Equipment Operator, with the understanding that he would renew his certification annually.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman D. Hansen, with all members in favor, to appoint DPW Employee James Welch to the position of Deputy Municipal Department Head and permit him to take a leave of absence from his position of Equipment Operator and that he must renew his certification annually to maintain his status of Equipment Operator.

DISCUSSION

Committeeman D. Hansen stated that Township Recycling Coordinator K. Hansen has been inspecting charitable clothing bins throughout the township to ensure compliance with township

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regulations. One bin belongs to a company that is no longer in business, however, they have yet to remove it. Committeeman D. Hansen recommended removing the abandoned bin and relocating it to the Municipal DPW Complex for inclusion in a future surplus sale, but suggested waiting until township officials complete the application process for the remaining bin companies.

Township Committeeman T. Dooley referred to recommendations made by a court-appointed Mediator Mr. M. Boland concerning Hampton Township's Housing Element and Fair Share Plan (HEFSP). Mr. Boland stated in his recommendations that the township "will reserve sufficient water and sewer capacity", however, the developer is responsible for reserving these resources, not the municipality.

Township Administrator E. Klose confirmed that it is the developer's responsibility and stated that she would discuss the matter further with Township Planning Board Attorney R. Morgenstern.

HAMPTON TOWNSHIP FIRE AND RESCUE UPDATE

HTVFR Chief stated that members responded to a total of 478 fire and EMS calls during CY 2017.

HTFR is planning to hold a Wet-Down in May or June to christen the newly purchased HTVFR Fire Truck.



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


