HANKS WILLIAMS AND CORNDOG DELIGHTS WIN DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIPS

All Division winners in the 3rd round have won at least one previous round except HANKS WILLIAMS and CORN-DOG DELIGHTS who were three round winners. 3rd round results: GEM DIVISION - The Dartboard Shoppe Lancers defeated the Heavy Heavers 6-3 in the position round to win their 2nd consecutive leg and as one of the teams in the finals. Tuffys, playing only three darters, whipped the Heavy Heavers 5-4 and will meet the Lancers in the finals. GOLD DIVISION - Hara Outlaws, winner of the 3rd round, gained the finals by beating the Lions Den 5-4 in the position round. Hara squeaked by the Cubbyhole Crunchers 5-4 and will meet the Lions Den March 31. RED DIVISION - Hanks Williams won their 3rd consecutive round to take the Division Championship. Benedicts Champs took their 3rd consecutive second place round for 2nd place trophy. Wee Bee Units defeated the Gold Key 5-4 on Tim Arthur's 501 singles win. Wee Bee will play Shroyer #2 March 31 for 3rd place. BLUE DIVISION - The Misfits took the 2nd leg and qualified for the finals. The Irish Misfits, 5-4 winner over the Irish Rovers on March 24, will meet the Misfits in the Championship round. GREEN DIVISION - The Chillers 8-1 victory over the Countrysiders gave them a 3rd round one point margin over AJs Darters. The Chillers lost to Hanks Bullshooters 5-4 on Mike Linden's winning 501 singles game. Hanks will shoot AJs for the Division Championship,

ORANGE DIVISION - Corndog Delights won 3 consecutive rounds to take the Championship. Hanks took 2nd place also winning 3 consecutive rounds. Rich Derringer's win in the 50l singles gave the Lunatic Fringe a 5-4 victory over LeShaft in the playoffs. The

Lunatic Fringe will shoot Haras Short Shafts March 31 for 3rd place. YELLOW DIVISION - The Six Arrows, losing 6-3 in the position round to the Southsiders, wound up with a one point lead to win the 3rd round for their 2nd leg. Joes Bullseyes took the measure of the Southsiders 6-3 to earn the right to meet the Six Arrows for the Division title March 31. PINK DIVISION - LYT won the 3rd round by one point by virtue of a 7-2 victory over Spankys. This was their 2nd leg toward the Championship qualifying them for the finals. The Game Room Roudies defeated LYT Targets 7-2 and will shoot LYT for the Championship.

Patti Stanley was a member of the Club Pub Spearchuckers in the Blue Division. Marty Baldwin, captain, expressed the deep shock of team members of the news. Marty regarded Patti as a reliable, punctual and personable dart shooter.

Chris Stroop was a member of Hanks Williams, who took first place in each of the three rounds in the Red Division. Mike Siney, captain of Hanks, and team members lost their co-captain and one of their best friends. Mike considered Chris a congenial, competitive darter who was a team player.

The DDA extends its deepest sympathy in these days of sorrow to the Stanley and Stroop families.

SHROYER INNS NEW SUMMER LEAGUE

EDITORIAL

On May 15 you will be asked to elect officers and a board of directors for the DDA. This democratic process should not be construed as a simple matter to elect qualified people to administer and direct your organization. Careful consideration should be given to candidates who have the interests of the Association and who are willing to devote the time and effort to make it succeed and progress.

Your candidates should be knowledgeable of all phases of Association operations and be interested and participate in local, state and national darting affairs. Your candidate should be amenable to the wishes of his constituents and well aware of the welfare of the Association.

The proficiency of the administration and operation of any organized group, for a common cause, can be directly related to the administrative ability of its chief officer, whatever his title may be. The ability to be able to efficiently plan, organize and direct the programs, equipment, finances, or personnel, is a prime qualification for a chief officer.

This is a decision you will be required to make May 15. You have time to discuss this with your teammates, other darters, present officers or Board members, or prospective candidates for office. DO SO.

In order to help you make decisions concerning prospective Association officers, I would like to see a Standing Nominating Committee appointed to evaluate and present their recommendations to the Board for approval and election. In order to aid the membership in making a selection, the names of all candidates for office could be published prior to the election. You do have some responsibility in this organization, use it.





EDITOR'S NOTE: On March 19 a number of darters embarked upon a tangible method of rating the skill of Dayton darters. Until a more proven or more infallible method is presented, let's back Julie and Pat on determining a rating system based on something other than, "I think . . ." Perhpas this may be the start of a long sought handicap system. I am positive this is a step in the right direction.

The procedure should not stop at the Intercity Challenge. I would like to propose this rating system be used to classify all darters in the DDA and each darter be given a classification. The rating then would be of value in determining the level of each shooter. Also, I feel this should be an annual requirement for all darters to be used for special teams representing the DDA and for placement in Division play. What do you think....?
