Pentecost Sunday Year C Acts of Apostles 2:1-11

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches,

Pentecost Sunday Year C

Acts 2:1-11 or John 20:19-23

"Now you are speaking my language!" People often say this when a topic of conversation and someone's speech moves favorably to something they know a lot about, or something they enjoy more. Like a car enthusiast who lights up when you start talking about a '64 Mustang' or a '57 Chevy Bel Air', or how about when a young person wakes up as you mention the news report that a Tik-Tok vulnerability was discovered that allows all record of disappearing messages to be sent to a third party with full contact info (talk about ransom-ware!) I might get all 'open-eared' like that when I hear the words, 'Chocolate Chip Cookie Dough' or 'Mini-Pin' pups in someone's conversation! Well yes, of course, you have my ear for sure, whenever someone brings up the gospel, or theology or spirituality. We all have hobby interests that are so close to our hearts! Today's first reading from the Acts of the Apostles Chapter 2 detailing Pentecost morning is such an example of how God can speak 'everyone's language' simultaneously to draw us all into the same circle of conversation (what good religion does!) The reading tells about how visitors to Jerusalem from all over the known world were listening to the apostles speaking, and yet each person amazingly heard them speaking in each person's own native language! Now you are talking! All of a sudden, I hear you, because you are now talking to my heart (what is so important to me)! What a miracle of language, that somehow by the Holy Spirit, the apostles were using words, dialects or tones that each person could understand getting across to them the good news of Jesus Christ. That is Divine Communication! Sometimes we refer to this gift of universal speech as the gift of tongues (as if we are using God's own language to speak to each other person's own soul). People have described this phenomenon of many different people all comprehending the same communication, as being similar how we all know such other universal languages as 'music', 'love' or even 'food'. Jesus wanted to break through all language barriers and speak directly to our hearts. In so many places in the gospels, I imagine Jesus desiring to speak to us so personally, that He asks, "How can /I get through to you, please help tell me what language I need to speak for you to hear me!" For example, in Mark 4:30 Jesus said, "To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it?" He was seeking the right word, the right vocabulary and best illustrations to break through our incomprehension. He wants to get through to us, despite all the static and noise around. Such breakthroughs, take time and a lot of 'presence' (being with someone) to know how best to speak to someone and get across to them what you are truly saying. I hear Jesus come to this point in His Last Supper teaching to the apostles, when He looks forward to the coming days of Pentecost (still yet in the future) saying, "I have told you this in figures of speech. The hour is coming when I will no longer speak to you in figures but I will tell you clearly about the Father" (John 16:25). But such divine communication is just that-a divine gift! This miracle of a universal human language is a gift from the Holy Spirit. Acts 2:4 says, "they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim." It takes the Holy Spirit! This highlights the work of God behind this special phenomenon. We always say that God alone can read the human heart. God alone can reach our innermost souls. As Romans 8:26-27 tells that "the Spirit Itself intercedes with inexpressible groaningsAnd the one who searches hearts knows." But by grace, we can hear and understand! I think of two special places in scripture where we see encounters when Jesus definitely spoke and broke through barriers to resonate in a person's heart. An early example was when He spoke with the woman at the well, and she responded by running to tell the town of her experience by saying, "Come see a man who told me everything....." (John 4:29). A much later example is the reaction of the two disciples walking to Emmaus, who realized that Christ was the one stirring their souls through speech, when they exclaimed, "Were not our hearts burning [within us] while he spoke to us.... (Luke 24:32). For sure, in both of these cases we hear how God speaks to hearts with an 'internally refreshing word' (Jn 4:14).

I love how the scriptures so often circle back on themselves to reveal deeper meaning, the longer we sit with it (let then work more and more into us). For example, all of this wordy meditation from me today, is reflected most simply in Jesus' own speech, where He taught about himself being the Good Shepherd. In John chapter 10:4, He said, "the sheep follow him (The Good Shepherd), because they recognize his voice." (*John 10:4*). By the way, though Number Symbolism is always overplayed in scripture, I love this conclusion from Jesus today: 'His sheep hear His voice'! That is John 10:4, really? Okay, copy that, good buddy, over and out! (CB Talk from old 'Smokey & Bandit movie!).


St. Paul ends his letter to the Romans, by addressing or asking about 29 different people (19 men & 10 women), with names like Olympas, Hermes, Mary, Phoebe, Prisca-Aquila, Andronicus, Junia, Persis, Rufus & Rufus' mother, and Aristobulus among others. We are tempted to think of them as just names, but oh, they are so much more than that! Each name has story or many stories Paul could tell about sharing life with them. Paul knows what grace they have given to him. He also knows that he is where he is, because of them! Well, me too! With You! It may be that Paul is merciful to us only include those 29 people, because Paul proves in lot of other places in his letter writing, that he can spin a long sentence! If he wanted to go on and on, he surely can! I always feel like him when it comes to thanking people and running long on names to catch everyone-but inevitably I feel like a failure because I am sure that I am missing someone. So a long time ago, I cultivated the practice of picturing in my mind everyone involved in my memory experiences. I always try to think of everyone I have encountered in this or similar situations I find myself in (like asking, 'Have I been here before *and with who?*') It becomes quite the joy to do this. I love it! So, if you ever hear me talking to myself or worse, yes, even laughing with myself, you know I am recalling those special people God has blessed me to know and work with, some recently and some long ago. But please keep in mind, that you are that person at some point or other in my remembrances! Thank you so much for blessing me!
