

### **Going Above and Beyond**

We know of or have heard about people who were able to accomplish remarkable goals and accomplishments through sheer determination and effort. They were driven through hardships, sacrifice, and exhaustion toward the end they were striving to achieve. Some people are blessed with a never-quit attitude. This attitude was captured in a movie titled *Rudy* that was made back in 1993. This movie is based on a true story of a young man who loved Notre Dame football and wanted nothing more than to play for the team. He was a walk-on, undersized, too slow and too small. He was so determined to make the team and play in a game that he practiced harder and worked harder than anyone else on the team. At one point in the film, the coach said, "I wish God would put your heart in some of my players' bodies." To play for the Notre Dame Fighting Irish, Rudy went above and beyond.

Most of us are not going to excel on the football field, but, as God's people, we are called to work diligently in our service to others and to extend God's kingdom. The Apostle Paul wrote, *"Be steadfast... always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain"* (1 Corinthians 15:58b). God wants us to *"walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to Him: bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God"* (Colossians 1:10). God wants us to be productive people in His kingdom.

As Christians, we are called into ministry. Through faith we become more than just spectators. Just as Jesus ministered to the people of His time, we are to do the same today. *"For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you"* (John 13:15). Our ministries take place in our homes, in our neighborhoods, in our churches, and in our places of work. Jesus said, *"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:19-20). Reaching out to the lost is at the very heart of our ministry. We have in Christ the saving truth of the Gospel that all people need to hear.* 

With God's help, we can go above and beyond in our efforts to please God and give Him the glory He deserves. When we commit our lives and resources to His service, we will hear Him say, *"Well done, good and faithful servant!"* (Matthew 25:23).

#### From Pastor's Desk....

Anno Domini is Latin for "the year of our Lord." Historically, years were marked with the year and the initials A.D. to remind us all whose year it was. The 20<sup>th</sup> Century's move away from the Christian ordering of days removed A.D. Perhaps it is time for Christians to bring it back.

2020 was certainly full of unexpected events. They weren't really unprecedented. Many people have experienced pandemics, elections, and life circumstances far worse than we did in 2020, but we must acknowledge and give thanks for the previous years of health and stability we have enjoyed, but can we be thankful for 2020? Can we see the Lord's hand of blessing, as well as His hand of teaching and discipline? If we can't, perhaps we should do some more reflecting.

St. Paul wrote to the Philippians: <sup>ESV</sup> **Philippians 4:12** I know how to be brought low, and I know how to abound. In any and every circumstance, I have learned the secret of facing plenty and hunger, abundance and need. <sup>13</sup> I can do all things through him who strengthens me. Christ was the difference. Christ made hunger and need bearable. He made plenty and abundance more meaningful because of the times of hunger and need. That is why every year is the Lord's year. Every year He gives the gift of His presence, every year He gives the gift He gives of forgiveness and life, each gift of daily bread is the measure of His love, but so is the struggle, the discipline, and the challenges.

Will 2021 be any better? Maybe? Maybe not? But will it be the Lord's year? Absolutely. I pray you begin the Lord's year with one of my favorite passages that often share with people: <sup>ESV</sup> **Psalm 31:15** My times are in your hand. We know whose hands those are: the hands of our Lord once stretched out on Calvary, made glorious in the resurrection, and extending n prayer for us before the Father. We have Jesus. He is with us always. 2021 is HIS year!


