Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

33rd Sunday Ordinary Year B

Mark 13:24-32

"The sky is falling-says Henny Penny!" From an old British children's fairy tale, also called 'Chicken Little', we hear how panic can lead to dangerous over-reactions. Henny-Penny had a simple acorn fall on her head, and she began a chain reaction of fear that ultimately led to all of the yard animals being duped into fleeing for safety in the fox's den, from which none of them came out (he ate them all!) The fox should have been wisely feared, but not the sky!

Are we in the end-times? We have been hearing such a question circulate a lot in conversations the last couple of years. Jesus gives us wise guidance on answering it. Basically, don't worry yourself. It shouldn't matter. In Luke 21:8, Jesus says, "See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time is here.' But do not follow them!" Simply keep the Faith and be a disciple of Jesus no matter what - maybe it is the end, maybe it is not. Is my being a disciple dependent on what eon (age) I am living in – the end of days or not? If it is, then I guess I would be a 'foul weather follower' of Jesus - only being a disciple when we are moved by fear instead of being moved by pure love for Him. Jesus advises that "by your perseverance you will secure your lives (Luke 21:19) and for us to "be vigilant at all times and pray" (Luke 21:36). In Luke 21:9, Jeus even says, "Do not be afraid"!

I know immediately after hearing that, some people will ask, "Then what about 'Fear of the Lord'?" That is one of the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit: 'Fear of the Lord'. Keep this in mind, that not long ago, that gift was renamed 'Wonder and Awe' in the Confirmation Liturgy (similarly, 'piety' was renamed 'reverence'). The change in translation reflects that healthy Fear of God is not meant to imply a shuddering paralysis in God's presence, but rather a proper respect and awe acknowledging God's omnipotence. The idea is that God's authority and might is 'awesome' to behold, and wisely to be always acknowledged. God is God and I am not – He is above, beyond, within and all behind everything. There are many scriptures references to the phrase 'Fear of the Lord'. The most often quoted is Psalm 111:10 "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom" (also Proverbs 9:10 & Job 28:28). Also, in the New Testament book, The Acts of the Apostles, we hear about people supportive of Christianity, who eventually convert to it, referred to as 'God Fearers' such as Corneliius Acts 10:2 (also Acts 13:16 & Acts 17:4). I interpret these references to indicate a healthy study and appreciation of God's attributes and action in the world – reflective of people in relationship to God (though early on) who are coming to knowledge of God and know Him as the Almighty-Creator and Guide of all Life. Another dimension of this 'healthy respect' of God's life-creating authority is that what we fear is not living up to God's intention for our lives, or even losing God's love because of our sin/selfishness. This is a similar hesitance or fear that may be in our human-to-human relationships, when we maintain love and respect for others, because we do not want to jeopardize our relationship or lose our link with them. Such fear, would then mean that I serve and love the other person, because I fear losing you and losing your love. Again, I understand the point of such 'holy fear', to be, that we wish to make our number one priority the fact that we acknowledge that other person's presence. They are always foremost in our mind. Of course, God is the most unique case of such 'holy fear', as the object of our reverential 'wonder and awe'. The change in tone from the 'fear' of the Old Testament to the 'faith' of the New Testament comes with the teaching and life of Christ Himself. Jesus teaches us to call out or approach God confidently without paralyzing fear, naming God 'Father' to us, when he taught the Lord's Prayer (Matt 6:9-13 & Luke 11:2-4). I like how the two prayers found in Luke chapter 1, prayers of the Blessed Mother and Zechariah both reflect this new 'healthy respect' (but not timidly fearful) of God. In Luke 1: 50, Mary prays, "God's mercy is from age to age to those who fear him." Zechariah prays in Luke 1:74, that God has come to His people, that "without fear we might worship him." But the best scripture quote that captures this newfound sense of respect and care that should replace our 'fear and trembling' is from 1 John 4:18 that "perfect love drives out all fear." And Christ brings that perfect love to birth in our souls when we accept Him and His proper place in our lives. Peace. Fr Brian
