ALEX W. CAMPBELL, Elkton
—Dr. Alex W. Campbell, 81, a
physician nearly 57 years in the
Thumb and northern Michigan,
died Sunday in Hubbard Memor-
ial hospital, Bad Axe, and a brief
illness.

Dr. Campbell entered the hospi-
tal Saturday night.

Born Oct. 9, 1877, in Forest,
Ont., Dr. Campbell spent his boy-
hood there. He was a school
teacher several years in Ontario.

He began the practice of medi-
cine in 1902 at Port Sanilac after
he was graduated by Saginaw Val-
ley Medical College.

He also practiced at Metz and
Posen in northern Michigan be-
fore coming in 1914 to Elkton.

His wife died April 30, 1951.

Dr. Campbell is survived by a
foster daughter, Mrs. Albert
Wright, Mt. Clemens; two grand-
children, two sisters, Mrs. Jean
McEachern and Mrs. Helen Cro-
thers, both of Elkton, and two
brothers, Angus, Forest, and
Archie, Woodstock, Ont.

Funeral services will be held at
2 p. m. Wednesday in the Metho-
dist church.

Three ministers, Rev. Leo
Burch, pastor of the Methodist
church; Rev. Robert E. Briggs,
Bad Axe Baptist church, and Rev.
Miss Mae Shupe, Colfax United
Missionary church, will officiate.

Burial will be in Port Sanilac
cemetery.
