If you need fabric that is prepared for dying, Mickey offers fabric - it's \$9 yard, Joanne needs to know by the end of our August meeting. Supply List: Next Page or available online Sign up NOW! (Few spots available) Contact Joanne Gardner to sign up.Description: (Two day class); In a relaxed atmosphere of warmth and good humor, this class is an introduction for the non-painter to the use of non-toxic transparent permanent textile paints on cotton fabric suitable for quilts. Students will spend the first day painting skies, water, and more to become familiar with the various effects that the watercolor paints produce when diluted to certain degrees and when applied with brushes, sponges, and bottles. During this time, students will also experiment with mixing colors, manipulating fabric, and painting many special effects pieces for blue skies, sunsets, leaves, earth, and others. The second day gives students the opportunity to develop more








sophisticated color combinations through a concentration on mixing colors, as well as creating individual painted landscapes and several other landscape techniques for interesting results. Students generally complete about 3 - 5 yards of fabric pieces if weather is good and they are able to dry fabric outdoors. The designs produced are a combination of planning and serendipity and give the students a hands-on basis for future exploration in hand-coloring fabric. **Instructor's Website:** <u>skydyes.com</u>



SUPPLY LIST FOR: "PAINTING LANDSCAPE FABRICS" (2 day class) Instructor: Mickey Lawler

Note: Students must be able to work in a large, well-lighted room with plenty of floor space on which to dry their painted fabrics in case of inclement weather. However, direct access to sunny, outdoor space is always preferable for drying. Direct access to water and sinks is essential.

Each student must bring:

Brushes and Sponges: A couple kitchen sponges; plus 1 natural sponge about the size of your hand. (Automotive and hardware stores are often cheaper than art supply stores.) About 8 – 10 cheap 1" – 2" natural bristle brushes and two 1"sponge brushes. (You will find these at Michael's or other craft or hardware stores.)

A couple dozen pairs of rubber gloves (disposable type from pharmacy work best).

Plastic Bags for possibly taking home damp fabric.

Paint containers: 10 – 15 half-pint cottage cheese style containers or snack-size Gladware, plus 2 containers that will fit the natural sponge.

Plastic Plant Mister or Spray Bottle: At least 16 oz. and make sure it "mists".

3 – 4 FoamCore boards: 20" X 30", 3/16" – ¼" thick. (Art supply stores or Staples), covered on one side with Contac Paper.

***** OR: *****

1 FoamCore board: 20" X 30", 3/16" – ¼" thick, and cut a large lightweight plastic drop cloth, clear or white, into 24 pieces, 2 ft. X 1.5 ft. each.

Fabric: 4 - 6 yards of white "PFD – prepared for dyeing - 100% cotton. Broadcloth is a nice weight. (I buy my broadcloth #453 from Testfabrics, <u>www.testfabrics.com</u>. Kaufmann Pimatex or Patina is good also.) Do not cut. We will be doing that in class. It's not necessary to prewash fabric if drops of water sink immediately into the fabric. However, if drops of water sit on the surface, prewash fabric with detergent or choose a different fabric. No need to iron. OR you may email me at <u>Skydyes@comcast.net</u> AT LEAST 4 WEEKS PRIOR TO CLASS and request that I bring suitable fabric for purchase in class.

Other: Permanent marking pen, scissors, paper towel, a few straight pins





MINIS IN THE MILL

One of the successful fundraisers held during our CHQ biennial quilt show has been a raffle of mini quilts

made by the guild members. The raffle is conducted in tricky-tray fashion, with the drawing on the

afternoon of the last day of the show. It's a great opportunity for members, other quilters and non-quilters to take a chance at taking home a small piece(s) of quilted art made by CHQ members.

In the past we've raffled 50-60 mini quilts per show.

Please consider making at least one Mini for our October Courthouse Quilters Guild Show.

Here are the rules for Mini construction:

1. Your Mini can represent any theme and can be traditional, modern or an art quilt, either from a pattern

or your own creation.

2. Your Mini can be as small as 6"x6" (minimum) or as large as 24"x24" (maximum).

3. No cheater cloth.

4. Your Mini can be machine or hand quilted; no tied quilts.

5. Your Mini should have a label with quilt title (optional), your name, county, state, date and Courthouse Quilters. That way the lucky winner will know all about their new quilt and who made it. It's not necessary to add a hanging sleeve.

6. Your Mini must be handed in by no later than the September meeting. This will give the committee time to photograph the Minis and finalize other details.

Courthouse Quilters Board Meeting Minutes

June 11, 2021

In attendance: Cathie Giambalvo, Joanne Gardner, Jude McCormick, Laura Kohl, Penny Armagost, Joan Lasota, Marla Knappe, Stephanie Greenberg, Patty Gertz, Camille Quinton, Al Accettola, Andrea Cavallaro, Ellen Heath, Kerry Cogen and Cass Garner.

Meeting called to order at 7:09.

May 2021 Board Minutes. Cathie moved to approve. All in favor.

Old Business: Amended Standing Rules APPROVED by a majority vote (members present) at UFO Auction.

New Business & Board/Committee Status:

President: Cathie

Cathie had questions about Quilt Show Boutique Storage, location and cost of storage. Items are currently in a storage unit incurring a cost of over \$200 per month. These items will be stored until October 2021 until the period of the lease is over. There are 96 bins and 21 garbage bags of items in the storage unit. Ellen resigned from her position as Boutique Co-chair last month. Sue Garcia, Boutique Co-chair has agreed to be responsible for looking for future storage locations and guild members to volunteer to store items until our next show. Prior to October, her goal will be to reorganize, minimize and divide and store items based on subcommittee (books, fabric, notions, handmade items, etc). Cathie expressed concern about Ellen paying for boutique storage personally. Ellen said she didn't mind paying approx \$1200 to store the items and she considered it a donation to the Guild. Items are secure in a storage unit location near Phillipsburg, until Oct 2021.

1st Vice President/Program: Joanne - "Name That Tune Challenge"

Schedule- 3pm- hang ropes for quilts in gazebo bays, large ladders needed. Guild ladder is MIA- may still be stored in the kitchen of the lodge.

4pm- Quilt and item drop off

5pm- Picnic

6pm- Brief business meeting; Show 'n Tell.

Joan made a motion to discuss debating on switching from Zoom to FB live. Stephanie seconded. Concerns are about privacy. Content could be shared outside of the guild. What are the benefits? Most members have become comfortable with the use of Zoom, but not all have Facebook accounts.

Vote in favor of Facebook Live: 2 Opposed: 8

Program details for upcoming meetings:

July location- Member's market: Flemington women's club is available. The county complex is currently still not available.

August- TBD

September: Mickey Lawler Fee is \$20. Class fee is \$25. If fabric needs to be provided by Mickey, cost is \$9 yard, and she will need 1 month notice to provide it for the class. 12 people were signed up for the original class before it was rescheduled. Previously enrolled guild members have been reimbursed and will need to re-enroll. The list will start with the 12 previously enrolled. There are 8 remaining spots. Must sign up with Joann and the clipboard, online enrollment will not be an option for this class.

2nd Vice President/Program: Jude – Has not received any feedback from the virtual sampler platter regarding instructors for the upcoming year. Pursuing Daisy who teaches 4-5 classes for a virtual meeting, possibly February when we historically experience the worst weather. Jude is finding post pandemic that instructors are resistant to travel and prefer to teach virtually. Is a workshop needed for the meeting when the guild hosts a 'Sew for the Show' or post show analysis?

Treasurer: Patty - June Treasurer Reports UFO sales were very successful. Check written <u>for \$2312.23</u> (check treasurer's report) Baby quilts will have written gift acknowledgements upon request only. Changes with the tax code have made gifts less of a write off.

Corresponding Secretary: Kerry Complete set of keys are available for the mailbox. Notes to be sent out to Denise Lager, Linda Wood, Ellen and Andrea for surgeries and well wishes.

Charity: Stephanie - UFO Auction Report. Baby Quilt Initiative needs a document in the newsletter telling people what to do, count on how many quilts have been collected and Quilt label information.

Photo is not needed because the photo was taken last year and postcards were made, the date needs to be changed but the design can be used. Tickets need to be printed, state approval is still good because of COVID, municipal approval needs to be started for Stockton.

Quilt Show Co-Chairs: Camille & Andrea - Proposal for Fabric-anza!

This Fall Event will be a public event, but not be as large as the show.

The purpose would be to promote CHQ, to increase membership, launch raffle quilt sales, advertise 2020 Quilt Show, sell off some of the boutique excess items to decrease storage needs, and host a member created quilt sale.

Advertise with an email blast to previous show attendees and to local guilds.

Cathie created a motion to discuss Fabric-anza. Seconded by Patty.

Patty suggests the Pre-Sale of baby quilts. Have an exhibit of mini quilts (not for sale at this event).

Location where we can sell will need to be secured. Possibly a church or synagogue where there is a lot of space.

Vote on holding this event this coming October: All in favor

Joan suggests having an additional quilt or prize to raffle. Past shows had multiple prizes for each ticket. 1st, 2nd and 3rd. Joann says that will create problem with the quilt license and start over because we would need new appraisals, new tickets and a new license. Cass suggests a door prize which would create the need for an additional license. Would the cost be worth it? Discussion to be continued at a later date.

Vote to consider relicensing quilt and adding an additional quilt: 6 in favor 4 opposed. To be revisited next month.

Cathie nominated Ann Oswald to the CHQ Circulation Chair position.


No discussion.
