Tarp A Frame

POSITIVES: - PLENTY OF SPACE TO SLEEP 2 OR MORE PEOPLE - EASY FAST SETUP - GREAT DURING HEAVY RAINFALL NEGATIVES: - NO GROUNDSHEET - STILL LIMITED HEADROOM

Wedge Tarp

Advantages:

- Relatively quick set up
- No past experience needed

- Limited space
- Open side



Tarp Shelter

Advantages:

- Relatively quick set up
- No past experience needed
- Can use fire for warmth

- Not protected well from elements
- Need ridgeline and trees nearby




Lean-To

Advantages:

- Can use fire for warmth
- Use natural materials
- Does not require lots of skill

Disadvantages:

- Set up time



A-Frame

Advantages:

- Great insulation
- Protection from rain

- Set up time
- No Fire
- Need a lot of Materials
- Single person
- Very little living space




Debris Shelter

Advantages:

- Not as hard to make
- Can provide more room
- Don't need to spend as much time gathering the right materials (use what you have)

- Set up time
- No Fire
- Lot of materials needed




TeePee

Advantages:

- Fire inside shelter
- Long Term
- Can support a few people

- Set up time
- Practice required
- Lose headroom



No Shelter

Advantages:

- No Setup Required
- Sleep as many as needed
- Any environment
- No skill needed

No protection from the elements
