

When we went into the very last round, tied with Cleveland at 94 and having lost one of our best players, we could have folded like a tent. No way - we stepped up, and we had one of the best rounds of the day to clinch the win. Special town - special team.

I'm a lifelong lover of Dayton darts, and I'll never forget the feeling of being part of this years magnificent team - thanks Randy.

Who was Bill Bereda and why do we have an award named after him?

The DDA has been fortunate over its history to have had many outstanding members. Some have gone on to greater fame as champions, some are the "rocks" that teams form around every season. Some come, and some go. Icons or anonymous, they all make their mark. And Bill Bereda was all of that – maybe not a champion or a perennial team captain, but something more - a guy who thoroughly loved the game of darts and the people that played it.

Bill got started the way many of us did – a friend or coworker played and you think to yourself, "Hey, I could do that." For Bill, that inspiration came from Rick Davis, a longtime DDA member who worked with him at Delco Products in Kettering. Rick (or Rickie D as he's known) joined the DDA in 1981 and Bill followed him within a year or two. Throwing for a team called 'The Misfits', they threw in the B division, before the DDA went to color coding for the team levels. In their free time at work, Bill would write a CNC program and Rick would run the lathe to make sets of custom darts for themselves and others. They even adapted their homemade shafts to accept hammerheads if desired!

From Bill's very start, it was always about the game more than it was about himself. He had an ego, and like any of us, he wasn't beyond talking a little trash before taking on a match, but that's where things ended. Win or lose, Bill never failed to be gracious and polite. Like anyone who truly loves the sport, he got as much pleasure out of seeing someone else shoot well as he did when he shot well himself. No temper tantrums, no rude comments or refused handshakes. With his cigar nearby, Bill was the one you could always count on any time for a quick game of darts or an extended match. His daughter, Christie Kidd, remembers when they had some time left before the start of her marriage ceremony in 1982. The family was gathered at their house and it wasn't quite time to go yet. Before you knew it, Bill had everyone (including the bride) throwing a game of darts at the board he always kept up at the house. He loved to throw.


Like many people you wished you knew better, Bill left us too early. Diagnosed with Crohn's disease, a chronic condition, Bill ended up passing away from complications of that disease on May 27th, 1989. The leadership of the DDA, searching for an icon to embody their Sportsmanship Trophy several seasons later, voted unanimously to name it The Bill Bereda Award for Sportsmanship after the former DDA Board Member. It would be awarded annually to the one player that best represented the standards set by Bill and voted on by the members at the annual banquet.

His other daughter, Debbie Venys (Fugate at that time), presented the first award to her friend and fellow DDA member, Chris Sanders, at the 1993 DDA Banquet.

Keep Bill and his example in mind as you play and you'll be following a good path.

Darts in Dayton always starts and ends with friends. Toni Carmack knows better than most. Her own darting history started in the summer of 1999 when her friend, Patti Yinger (our DDA super secretary), asked Toni to play on her summer team.

Toni wasn't completely new to darts – not only had she played soft tip darts, but her husband, Frank Lovash, had joined the DDA in 1991 and was an active member and volunteer at many of the fish fries, banquets and other DDA functions. Toni came along to help and always ended up making new friendships as well. And as any stay at home mom knows, getting out is always a welcome relief (even if you end up cleaning).

After that first summer with Patti's team, Toni stayed with darts and found that not only was it fun, but she continued to make new friendships throughout the organization. As the only girl in a family of six kids, she was used to the mostly male competition and that never bothered her. In high school she was known as an excellent softball player with a wicked pitch, so darts was an extension of that skill set. By her second year she made the Dayton All-Star team and has thrown with them every year since, including this years' winning team.

All those years of making friends really paid back when cancer struck in 2002. Without the support of her dart "family", everything would have been a lot harder for her. "Darts gave me something to look forward to every day besides another four hours of chemo. It made things more bearable for me."

Fully recovered and throwing strong, Toni has brought her own circle of friends, relatives - and even her own daughter - into the family of darts. At least 8 additional players have come from the ranks of the Carmacks, and there are sure to be more over time.

A winner of the Bill Bereda Sportsmanship award in 2002, Toni is a welcome DDA member (and friend) wherever she goes.

WORDS OF WISDOM ON [QUITTING]


