November Reflection

Psalm 9:1-2 "I will give thanks to the Lord with my whole heart; I will tell of his wonderful deeds. I will be glad and exult in you; I ill sing praise to your name, O Most High."

I can't think of November and not think about thankfulness. The two just go hand and hand in my mind. About this time last year Teresa put on our church sign a question, one that has haunted me for the past year the question was: "What if you woke up today with only the things you thanked God for yesterday?" The more I thought on that question the more I realized just how often I can journey through days without giving thanks.

"Now say thank you." This is a phrase that is common in the Christy house, Crystal and I want our kids to have proper manners, we want our children to be thankful and to express their thankfulness. But for some reason it feels like I have to remind my kids at least six hundred times to say thank you. Now I noticed at Trunk or Treat, Crystal and I are not alone in this struggle for thankfulness. Apparently it is universal to every family, for with every single child that passed, there was a parent asking the child, "Now what do you say?" And the child looking at the candy, would very, quietly say, "Thank you."

It resonated with me that perhaps thankfulness isn't something that comes naturally to us. Or at best is something that we lose relatively quickly. As I sat down to really think on this I began to wonder, what is it that steals our thankfulness?

Now for my money I believe that the greatest thief of thankfulness is entitlement. Which may seem a little simple but my friends entitlement can be sneaky and disastrous, I don't mean entitlement as in a child pitching a fit in the toy aisle. The way entitlement worms its way into our hearts is far more insidious. You don't even see it coming.

At a certain point we stop being thankful and we start expecting things to just be given to us. You would never thank your employer for a paycheck, because you worked for that it is what is due you. In the same way a child doesn't thank a parent for food, because that child understands the parent is the one who provides food. But how often do we stop to just give thanks for a job or for the creation that makes a meal possible?

When our heart is rooted in thankfulness, every single day is a new opportunity to view life as a gift. But when we feel we are entitled to everything each day can become a source of frustration, grief and malice. Thankfulness can make all the difference.

This year has put our thankfulness to the test. So many things that we took for granted have been ripped out of our hands from the small things like going out to eat a restaurant to the bigger things like education, health, and jobs. Our world has been flipped upside down.

King David is someone who knew what it was like to have his world turned upside down. David was a man who frequently found himself on the run from enemies, and yet even during times of struggle and

strife, David found ways to give thanks to God. Psalm 9 is a perfect example of this, David lays bare his struggles but even in the midst of a time of tribulation David finds ways to glorify God.

2020 has been a time of struggle for many of us. I know this year hasn't gone the way that a single one of us planned, but we still have so much to be thankful for. We have each other, we have the church, and most importantly of all we have God. Perhaps instead of looking for things that might be wrong, why not look at each day as a gift.

I promise you this; the more we approach life out of a sense of thankfulness and gratefulness, the more we will be able to shine the light of God in a world that is so often unthankful. Just as Jesus Christ told the disciples some two thousand years ago, our job is to be the light of the world. May you shine and may thankfulness be the oil that keeps you going.

So you can fully appreciate the efforts of our Choir during this phase of restrictions for in-Sanctuary worship, please understand that the Choir must observe the following: masks still must be worn inside near others, no *full choir singing, no more than 4 singers in the choir at one time, no* congregational hymn singing, no hymnal or sheet music can be used, no microphones can be shared, no singing in front of or behind another, and spacing must be 6 feet apart in one line.
