


Left: The Knit, Crochet and Needle crafts group filled our display case with beautiful creations.






Required Minimum Distribution from your IRA—If you are 70 1/2 or older and have an IRA, you know that each year you must take your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). But did you know that you can make a transfer directly from your IRA to a charity of your choice and the contribution is not taxed? You can give up to \$100,000 from your IRA to a charity and it will be counted towards your RMD but isn't included in your adjusted gross income. Simple Hamburger Soup

2 lbs. ground beef, cooked and drained

1 28 oz. can of diced petite tomatoes

2 14 oz. cans beef broth (or use equivalent water and beef soup base)

1 10 oz. bag of gumbo soup vegetables (or raw okra, onion, celery, carrots, and green peppers

1/2 cup of uncooked pearl barley

1 tsp. Italian seasoning
