

FIXING IT ON MY SCHEDULE by Mark Leder

As we move towards the cooler months of fall and trying to make the most of the remaining time to spend some quality time with my car on the up coming Great Northern Tour I decided to take a look at my car for reliability issues for a successful tour. It occurred to me that my battery wasn't exactly new. I always put the purchase date on the battery and how time flys - my battery was now 10 years old. It has never failed me but at this age there cannot be to much dependable life left. It was sold as a typical 24 month warranty battery. I think I got my monies worth on this one. An aggravating job for me is when I need to remove the floor boards from my Model A. My mind pictured the scene of a cool morning up in Hayward WI. as the group gets ready to start on an adventure and my car fails to start due to a battery failure. I know I could get plenty of people to push start me or I could get out the crank and get it going but really I'm going to need a new battery so why not replace it at my leisure and at home within the comfort of my garage and my favorite tools.

When you can take your time and be in your own garage with no pressure you can do a complete professional replacement. In this particular car it had been converted to 12 volts and my ground polarity is now negative but that really does not change the job. After pulling the carpet and the floor boards (hate it) I removed the battery and noticed the battery carrier and the retainer on top had begun to rust probably from the off gasing of the battery and the location that is pretty much in the open. I removed the rust and repainted. With that done I turned my attention to where the battery cable lug makes contact with the frame and I took a small dremel grinder to the mounting area to brighten the metal to a clean shinny surface. Next I used a file to brighten and clean the two cable ends that attach to the battery and I splurged on two new battery clamp bolts. The last step that I do is use a product that helps to ensure a good electrical connection that repels corrosion. This product is used on outdoor antenna connections and connections exposed to the elements. It has powdered copper and I think it is mixed with a grease like substance that has some conductive properties. Other items that help to repel corrosion are the old tricks of smearing grease, vaseline, and dielectric grease over the cable ends once in place. You don't want these grease items between the connection surfaces. You want metal to metal contact. You can also purchase at an auto parts store the treated felt washers that sit atop the battery post under the battery cable clamps. The purpose they preform is that gases from the battery tend to escape around the battery terminals as the rubber case ages and the vibrations of the road stresses the fit of the case to the terminal lug resulting in corroded cables. Once all is done I use a paint marker and boldly letter the polarity of the terminals and the install date of the battery. I feel confident now that I have done everything to prolong my battery life and will only have to occasionally check the cables and the exterior of the battery case for signs of possible failure issues arising.

As long as we are on the subject of batteries and soon cars go into to storage many people use the modern battery maintainer devises and they do a good job. The only things I've heard about them is it is not always necessary to leave your battery hooked to one full time but rather once or twice a month you can hook it up for a day or two. It's a rather inexpensive item and as a caution I would place it as far from the car as I could and on a non flammable surface once you have it energized just in case something inside of it fails. I've also seen discussions about removing the ground cable from the battery once a car is in storage as a good idea , I do it and feel more confident as it completely isolates the electrical system from the car


Lunch And Then Some Stuff by Mark Leder
