



Media and Spectator Rules



A significant investment has been made by Innova Champion Discs and the PDGA which includes the media rights to cover the GCC. **All commercial media must be approved by Innova Champion Discs.** Media includes individuals representing a known or unknown media outlet for print, radio, television, internet, and/or video publication. Spectators with personal cameras, cell phones, or other portable devices are not considered media and are not granted media access.

Approved media shall abide by the following:

- Must not approach competitors within 30 minutes of their tee time nor at any point during their round. This applies to Starter's Tent area, transition between holes, and while waiting to tee or play.
- Must remain at least 10 meters (33 feet) from competitors during play.
- Must remain at least 10 meters (33 feet) from all DISCatcher targets.
- Must make every effort to maintain positions on the course that do not interfere with competitors or tournament play. Competitors and/or GCC staff may request that media representatives reposition themselves if their position is considered inappropriate or distracting.
- Must not block a shot already set by another form of media. Both still and video media share priority and are expected to demonstrate appropriate professional courtesy.
- Must remain completely still when in close proximity to any competitor who is in the process of lining up or executing a throw.
- Should avoid being in direct sightline of players. This may sometimes be unavoidable, particularly around the putting area. Competitors and/or GCC staff may ask for you to move.
- Still photographers must either position themselves so that camera shutters cannot be heard by competitors during the throwing motion, or begin shooting once the disc has left the competitor's hand.
- Cell phones must remain silent at all times while on the course.
- Violations of any of these rules are grounds for immediate removal from the Wild Horse Golf Course facility.

A significant investment has been made by Team GCC which includes the rights to use the Wild Horse Golf Course. **The facility has been reserved for a private function, and public access is not guaranteed.** All spectators shall behave appropriately. Unless otherwise provided, spectators may not play on any GCC courses. Additionally, Spectators with personal cameras, cell phones, or other portable devices are not considered media and not granted any type of media access.

Spectators shall abide by the following:

- Must not approach competitors within 30 minutes of their tee time nor at any point during their round. This applies to Starter's Tent area, transition between holes, and while waiting to tee or play.
- Must remain at least 10 meters (33 feet) from competitors during play.
- Must remain at least 10 meters (33 feet) from all DISCatcher targets.
- Must remain behind GCC staff, when in position for crowd control purposes. (Likely during final round.)
- Must make every effort to maintain positions on the course that do not interfere with competitors or tournament play. Competitors and/or GCC staff may request that spectators reposition themselves if their position is considered inappropriate or distracting.
- Must remain completely still when in close proximity to any competitor who is in the process of lining up or executing a throw.
- Should avoid being in direct sightline of players. This may sometimes be unavoidable, particularly around the putting area. Competitors and/or GCC staff may ask for you to move.
- Use of personal media devices must either position themselves so that camera shutters cannot be heard by competitors during the throwing motion, or begin shooting once the disc has left the competitor's hand.
- Cell phones must remain silent at all times while on the course.
- Violations of any of these rules are grounds for immediate removal from the Wild Horse Golf Course facility.
