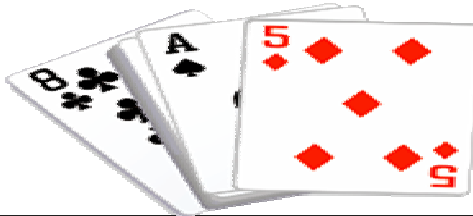

It was good to see Herb and Judy Howes back too. Herb had knee surgery recently, and looks to be on the mend! President Doug Troost reported that our April Dust Off cruise to Shipshawana was a big success! He thanked Doug and Linda Kamphuis, as well as Bob McCarthy for organizing the cruise.

Terri Miller presented her Treasurer's Report and she's happy to report that we are still in good financial shape.

For next month's meeting, we will be having a Poker Run, organized by Ron and Elaine VanZytveld. We will meet at Famous Dave's first, and begin our run from there. Doug asked for a show of hands of those who were planning to go to the Convention this summer in Dayton, Ohio. Surprisingly, not many raised their hands. All I can say, this will be the biggest all-Pontiac show ever, and it may never happen again. Plus it is fairly close to home. If you can spare the time, I can promise you, you won't regret going.

Our guest speaker was Jim Mattison, owner of PHS (formally known as Pontiac Historic Services). Jim has spent his entire career with the auto industry, starting out at Chevrolet, handling the COPO orders in the late sixties. He then went on owning several businesses tied with the auto industry, ultimately starting PHS in the early 90's. The topic of Jim's presentation was his perspective of the death of our beloved Pontiac Motor Division. It all began in 1992 when the GM Board went outside the corporation to hire new leadership. That new leadership decided to merge Pontiac and GMC Divisions. To Jim's eye, it was a takeover. It's unfortunate that all the managers in charge, from this point on, did not have Pontiac's best interests in mind. None of them made any attempt to preserve Pontiac's "excitement" image that earlier managers had created, starting with Bunkie Knudsen in the late 50's. The only bright spots were Bob Lutz and Jim Bunnell who pushed to get exciting cars for Pontiac like the new GTO, the Solstice, and the G8. But it was too little, too late. The GM bankruptcy had them crawling to the federal government for help, with their car czar saying they had too many divisions. The

result was GM dumping Hummer, Saturn, and either Buick or Pontiac. Even though Pontiac outsold Buick six to one in the US, Buicks were popular in the emerging China market because they were status symbols there. (U.S. Generals drove Buicks there during WWI and WWII.) With that, Pontiac officially closed its doors October 31, 2010.

On a brighter note, Karen Shillito won the 50/50 raffle of \$39.50! Then Tom Ensing won the attendance drawing, worth \$89.00! Congratulations to both!
