PONDERINGS FROM PASTOR CATHIE

"To the church of God that is in West Fargo, ND, to those who are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints, together with all

those who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." Those words written by Paul, are as relevant today as they were the day he wrote them to the Corinthians.

We are entering a significant period in our church year as Advent is the beginning of the church year, Year B. During the months that this newsletter covers, December 2017 and January 2018, we go through two "seasons" of the church year: Advent and Christmas, as well as an extended time called Epiphany.

Advent is recognized with the liturgical (Continued on page 2)

color of PURPLE, although some churches use the color blue. The word "ADVENT" means coming or arrival. Advent is a season of Hope. During Advent

we wait for the baby to be born so we can celebrate the nativity. It also reminds us of the second coming of the Lord. During communion, we often say these words: "Christ has come, Christ is ris-



en, and Christ will come again." The three truths define Advent as we wait and reflect and hope. The first Sunday of Advent is December 3 and goes through Sunday, December 24, the 4th Sunday of Advent. An action we can all pursue during advent is to take time for prayer and devotions specific to this season of our lives.

Christmas Eve, also on December 24, marks the beginning of the Christmas season as we celebrate the birth of the Christ child. What makes this year unique is that the 4th Sunday of Advent is on Sunday, December 24, which is also the beginning of the season of Christmas.

We will have two separate services of worship on the 24th of December. In the morning, we will have a regular worship service, focusing on the 4th Sunday of Advent. At 6:30 p.m. in the evening, we will have our Christmas Eve service, complete with Lessons and Carols, ending with lit candles and "Silent Night." The color of the Christmas season is WHITE.

The third date within these two months that we recognize is Epiphany. On January 6, the day of Epiphany, we commemorate the revelation of God's promise to the world. Candles are lit to recognize the light of Christ, the star that led the Magi to Bethlehem. Epiphany

calls us, as Christians, to go out and tell others of Christ, specifically God's gift of grace and salvation for all people. We celebrate Christmas, and then with Epiphany, we do the work Christmas

brinas. There are two scripture passages you may want to read, to learn more about Epiphany. One of the passages is from the Old Testament, and the other is a Gospel reading from the New

Testament: Isaiah 60:1-6 and Matthew 2:1-12.

On the day after the twelve days of Christ, our European Christian brothers and sisters recognize Epiphany by inviting guests who come together at the home of the host where they bless the home in the name of Christ, and the Magi. Together the guests go through a liturgy and end with prayer. As part of the blessing, the guests "Chalk the Door." Chalking the door involves writing, with chalk, three letters: CMB. The letters are translated as, "May Christ bless this dwelling." The letters are "book-ended" with the numbers of the current year. In between the letters and numbers, they place crosses. If you were to "Chalk the Door" at your house on January 6, it would look like this: 20 + C + M + B +18.

No matter what your tradition is with family and friends during Advent or Christmas, or on Epiphany, remember that we wait for, and celebrate the birth of God's Son, Jesus. According to Isaiah 9:6: "For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."

Our church is engaging in a second year of Angel Tree, a program of Prison Fellowship, which reaches




