FLAG SALUTE: Mayor Philip Yetter led the Flag Salute at 7:00 P.M.

NEW BUSINESS

**KITTATINNY REGIONAL HIGH SCHOOL DIRECTOR CHRIS CARROLL –
RE: HAMPTON TOWNSHIP RECREATION FIELDS**

The Township Committee reviewed a letter from Kittatinny Regional High School Athletic Director C. Carroll requesting the use of two Township fields for Lacrosse practice Monday through Friday from 2:30 P.M. until 5:15 P.M. Mayor P. Yetter suggested that in return for use of the fields, perhaps KRHS would agree to donate some field maintenance supplies and/or sports equipment to benefit Township Recreation programs, e.g., soccer nets, fertilizers, etc. Township Administrator E. Klose stated that in the past, KRHS has donated items upon request and agreed to contact Mr. Carroll to discuss the matter further.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman K. Gourlay, with all members in favor, to approve a request from Kittatinny Regional High School Athletic Director C. Carroll to use two Township fields to hold Lacrosse practice Monday through Friday from 2:30 P.M. – 5:15 PM during the months of March, April and May.

**FARMSIDE LANDSCAPE AND DESIGN – TURF PROGRAM 2017
PROPOSAL SPRING/FALL**

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman S. MacKenzie, with all members in favor, to approve a 2017 Turf Program Agreement between Hampton Township and Farmside Landscape & Design in the amount of \$2,695.00.

**AMERICAN LEGION BRANCHVILLE POST 157 – REQUEST FOR \$300.00
CONTRIBUTION FOR THE ANNUAL MEMORIAL DAY PARADE**

A MOTION was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Mayor P. Yetter, with all members in favor, to authorize a \$300.00 donation to the American Legion Branchville Post 157 for their Annual Memorial Day Parade.

**HAMPTON TOWNSHIP RECREATION PARK – ESTIMATES FOR WELL DRILLING
FROM WILLIAMS DRILLING AND DAN BALLENTINE WELL DRILLING, INC.**

The Township Committee reviewed estimates from Dan Ballentine Well Drilling, Inc and Williams Well Drilling to drill a new well at the Municipal Park that will replace the old well with substandard casing. Township Administrator E. Klose stated that it is impossible to know the precise drilling depth or length of casing in advance, which makes it difficult for the vendors to provide an exact cost. The expense per ft. submitted by Williams Well Drilling was lower for both the drilling and the casing.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman T. Dooley, with all members in favor, to award a contract for approximately \$6,400.00 to Williams Well Drilling in Shohola, Pennsylvania to drill a new well and install well casing at the Hampton Township Municipal Park.

**PUBLIC WORKS EQUIPMENT PURCHASE – QUOTES FOR DEBRIS BLOWER
FROM POWER PLACE AND STORR TRACTOR COMPANY**

The Township Committee reviewed two quotes from Power Place and Storr Tractor Company for the purchase of a Debris Blower for the Township Department of Public Works. Township Administrator E. Klose stated that Storr Tractor does not have an air deflector available, a part that Township DPW Manger D. Bayles highly recommends be included in the package.

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Township Administrator E. Klose stated that if the Township Committee makes a determination to approve a new Debris Blower, the funds to do so would come out of Road Maintenance.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman T. Dooley, with all members in favor, to award a contract in the amount of \$5,650.00 to Power Place in Rockaway, NJ for the purchase of a new Debris Blower with an Air Deflector.

Committeeman D. Hansen suggested eliminating the milling process from the paving project at the HTVFR Firehouse on Kemah-Mecca Lake Rd. He recommended putting a topcoat over the existing stabilized base coat in order to create a thicker surface that can withstand the weight of the fire trucks.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman K. Gourlay and seconded by Committeeman S. MacKenzie, with all members in favor, to approve Hampton Township's FY 2017 Capital Paving Projects, as recommended by Harold E. Pellow and Associates, Inc.

**HIRING OF SEASONAL TOWNSHIP DEPARTMENT OF
PUBLIC WORKS EMPLOYEE**

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Mayor P. Yetter, with all members in favor, to hire Seasonal Township DPW Employee Jesse Vaughn at a rate of \$15.00 per hour through October 2017.

DISCUSSION

Mayor P. Yetter stated that Hampton Township received a Federal Grant in the amount of \$100,000.00 to purchase and install a new generator that will service the Hampton Township Municipal Complex. The generator was recently installed and the project is near completion.

Committeeman K. Gourlay stated that as a member of the Sussex County Water Quality Advisory Committee, he has had the pleasure of attending several presentations given by Sussex County Watershed Director Nathaniel Sajdak. Committeeman K. Gourlay noted that we are lucky to have such a dedicated and driven individual working on behalf of Sussex County communities. Mr. Sajdak was also the Project Manager for the Rain Garden Project at McKeown Elementary School and is currently involved in a project to expand the Garden's infrastructure.

HAMPTON TOWNSHIP FIRE AND RESCUE UPDATE

Committeeman D. Hansen explained that HTVFR Officers were unable to attend the meeting due to a scheduling conflict.

Committeeman D. Hansen stated that HTVFR hosted a successful Garage Sale Fundraiser on April 22nd. The next fundraising event will be the Mother's Day Flower Sale, scheduled for May 17th- May 21st.

Mayor P. Yetter complimented the efforts of HTVFR members for organizing the HTVFR Easter Flower Sale and the HTVFR Pancake Breakfast to raise money for the Fire Department.

PUBLIC SESSION

Township resident Ms. K. Rotondi asked whether there were any updates regarding an issue discussed at a previous Township Committee Meeting involving the train trestle located on County Rt. 622 and tentative plans to replace the existing graffiti with a mural. Although the trestle is in Hampton Township, the State and the County each own certain sections. Committeeman S. MacKenzie explained that two meetings were scheduled with officials from these agencies to discuss the graffiti problem, but had to be postponed due to inclement weather. Committeeman S. MacKenzie stated that meetings will be rescheduled for a later date.

At a previous Township Committee Meeting, Ms. Rotondi suggested involving art students from Kittatinny Regional High School to help with the design and/or painting of the mural. She offered to approach school officials to discuss the possibility further. Township Administrator E. Klose asked Ms. Rotondi if school officials had responded to the request. It was stated that she spoke to KRHS Art Teacher H. Anderson, but she has not yet committed to participating in the project.

Committeeman K. Gourlay expressed concerns regarding traffic and safety issues on Swartswood Road (County Rt. 622) where the trestle is located. He explained that the road shoulder is narrow and would not provide an adequate buffer for the people working on the mural. Committeeman S. MacKenzie indicated that the precarious location of the trestle would make the project more complicated.

Mr. S. Martin, of 15 Route 206, LLC, stated that Attorney J. Kantowitz contacted Township Planning Board Attorney R. Morgenstern to discuss a few outstanding Affordable Housing issues. Mr. Martin stated that his attorney emailed responses to the unresolved issues at the request of Mr. Morgenstern in anticipation of tonight's meeting. Township Administrator E. Klose said that she spoke to Mr. Morgenstern earlier in the day and he did not indicate that he requested, or was waiting for, a response from Mr. Kantowitz.






