"MAKING ALL THINGS NEW" LWML TREATSHOP

Saturday, August 17, 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m., LWML will host their "LWML Treatshop". Calvary's LWML are hoping to get a group of ladies to attend. A registration fee of \$6.00, which will be covered by Calvary's Guild, will cover coffee/tea during the registration time, a bottle of water and snack, and material distributed at the Treatshop. Lunch will be provided for an additional \$6.00 or you may bring your own lunch.

There will be 3 informative sessions, 1 in the morning and 2 in the afternoon, along with the Opening Service and Closing Service. You will obtain program ideas and helps, resources like Bible studies and promotional tools, mission briefs, better understanding of the LWML website (Indiana and national), and how to use the knowledge and help of our District Leaders.

Even if you are unable to attend, you can help. The LWML Treatshop Ingathering recipients are Joy's House and Hope Center of Indy. Below is the list of items being collected.

Joy's House - serves adults living with life-altering diagnoses and their families by providing adult day care and caregiving services.

Needed items - batteries, copy paper, card stock, sticky notes, hanging file folders, manila file folders, clasp envelopes, bubble wrap, stamps, Avery 5160 & 5164 address labels, peel and stick name tags, dry erase markers & erasers, HP901 ink cartridges, sharpie pens, non-mechanical ice cream scoops, plastic forks and spoons, paper plates, cups & bowls (no Styrofoam), zipped baggies (gal. and sandwich), plastic wrap, wax paper, food service gloves, paper (watercolor, construction, & tissue), plastic crochet hooks, glue bottles, hole punches (various sizes and shape), masking tape, air dry clay, modeling clay, blunt-tipped scissors, paints (acrylic, fabric, puffy, watercolors), paint by numbers sets, old magazines, brushes, mason jars, large white t-shirts, picture frames and yarn.

Hope Center of Indy - serves to transform the lives of women exiting sex trafficking.

Needed items - disinfectant wipes, toilet paper cases, paper towels, white copy paper, construction paper, word puzzles, scrapbook paper, Kleenex (cubed boxes), napkins, playing cards, scotch tape, jeans/shorts in plus sizes, sweatshirts in plus sizes, underwear and socks (new), crayons, wax paper, hockey pucks, denture cleaner, tampons, feminine pads, brooms, spot and flood lights for exterior.
