**The Sacred Paschal Triduum---**We now enter into the holiest week of the year as we commemorate on this Palm Sunday Our Blessed Lord's entrance into Jerusalem where He will be handed over to be put on trial, scourged, crowned with thorns, and crucified. The three holiest days of this week are known as the **Sacred Paschal Triduum**. 'Triduum' is a Latin word meaning 'Three Days.' We call it the Paschal Triduum' because we celebrate what is known as the Paschal Mystery.' It is known as the Paschal Mystery' because it is the fulfillment of the ancient Jewish Passover (or Pasch), which commemorates the night God brought the Jews out of their slavery in Egypt. The unblemished, spotless lamb was slaughtered at the Passover meal and consumed--that same night the destroying angel "passed over" the homes that were marked with the blood of the Lamb, and those households were saved. This was the Old Testament prefigurement or foreshadowing of Jesus' work at the Last Supper--where He inserts Himself as the Paschal Lamb--and Calvary, where the sacrifice was offered to save us from our slavery to sin. In the Holy Eucharist, we consume the victim Who died for us. On **Holy Thursday**, the first day of the Triduum, we celebrate the institution of two sacraments--the Holy Eucharist and the Sacred Priesthood. Christ instituted both of these sacraments simultaneously when He said the words of institution' over the bread and wine ("This is my Body...This is My Blood") changing these ordinary means of nourishment into the sacred nourishment of His Body and Blood. In the context of saying these words He commanded His Apostles (and thus instituting them as priests). "Do this in remembrance of Me" (Lk 22:19). On **Good Friday** we celebrate the liturgy of Our Lord's passion in which we read the Passion of the Lord from St. John's Gospel. This is a very solemn liturgy which includes the Veneration of the Cross, and the character of the liturgy is one of sadness and sorrow for sin. This day is a day of fasting and abstinence as we remember Christ's giving up of His own flesh upon the Cross for our redemption. On **Holy Saturday** we remember Christ's 'descent into hell.' In the Apostles Creed we pray 'He descended into hell' (hell is translated *hades*, that is the temporary abode of the dead not the eternal fires of hell) which commemorates what Jesus did in the time between his burial and Resurrection, namely that He descended to the realm of the dead (also known as the 'Limbo of the Just') on Holy Saturday to save those righteous souls (like Moses, Abraham, the Prophets, etc.) who died before his crucifixion. On Holy Saturday Night we celebrate the Easter Vigil which is the high point of the Church's Liturgical Year. During this liturgy we will bring 3 new members into the Church. The liturgy is marked by the lighting of the Easter fire, blessing of the Paschal Candle, and the singing of the *Exultet*, the joyous Easter proclamation. During this liturgy we will once again sing the word of Easter joy and celebrate with great 'pomp and circumstance' the Resurrection of Christ!!! As we enter into this holiest week of the year, let us end our Lenten observance well and let us prepare our hearts to celebrate with joy the very glory of what it means to be a Christian---the Resurrection of Jesus Christ!.
