Your History Lesson for the Month of September:

September 1, 1939 - at 5:30 a.m. Hitler's Armies invade Poland starting World War II in Europe.

September 1, 1983 - Korean Air Lines Flight 007 was shot down by a Russian fighter jet while enroute from New York to Seoul killing all 269 persons on board.

September 1, 1923 - Boxer Rocky Marciano was born in Brockton, Mass. He died in a plane crash in 1969 and was the only undefeated heavyweight champion.

September 2, 1789 - The United States treasury was established by Congress.

September 2, 1945 - President Harry Truman declared VJ-Day (Victory over Japan Day).

September 2, 1945 - Ho Chi Minh proclaimed the Independence of Vietnam and establishment of the Democratic Republic of Vietnam.

September 3, 1939 - Great Britain and France declared war on Nazi Germany after its invasion of Poland two days earlier.

September 4, 1609 - The island of Manhattan was discovered by Navigator Henry Hudson.

September 5, 1847 - Jesse James was born in Centerville, Missouri.

September 8, 1900 - A hurricane with winds of 120 mph struck Galveston, Texas killing over 8,000 persons, making it the worst natural disaster in United States history.

September 12, 1913 - Athlete Jesse Owens was born in Oakville, Alabama.

September 13, 1814 - Francis Scott Key wrote a poem that in 1931 became the lyrics for the National Anthem.

September 13, 1971 - State Police and National Guardsman stormed Attica Prison in New York ending a 5-day prisoner revolt. Thirty one prisoners and 11 guards were killed.

September 13, 1860 - American General John J. Pershing was born in Lacklede, Missouri.

September 14, 1741 - Composer George Frederick Handel finished the *Messiah* after working on it non-stop for 23 days.

September 14, 1901 - Eight days after being shot, President William McKinley died from wounds suffered during an assassination attempt in Buffalo, New York.

September 16, 1908 - General Motors was founded by Entrepreneur William Crapo "Billy" Durant in Flint, Michigan.

IMPORTANT NEWS FROM POST COMMANDER GARY ZANARDI

The Youngstown Labor Day Committee has asked the Post to provide a color guard to participate in the Labor Day parade on September 4th. To do this effectively we should have 14 participants; 2 on the banner; 1 Color Sgt., 8 on flags, 2 with weapons; and one driving the sound vehicle. The more that participate, the better the impression.

With that in mind, dress should be one of the following: (1) VFW UNIFORM: Garrison Cap, white shirt, black tie, and black shoes or boots. (2) MILITARY UNIFORM: Dress uniform or fatigues or (3) STYLISH MILITARY/VETERANS ATTIRE: Historic uniforms (i.e.) jungle fatigues and/or veteran hats and vests.

ABSOLUTELY NO SHORTS, SANDALS, OR TENNIS SHOES.

ATTENTION FOR OUR OLDER VETERANS: You have the option of: (1) Riding in a military vehicle, or (2) Sitting on the reviewing stand in front of the Village Diner.

Family members and guests can also sit on the reviewing stand. PLEASE NOTE: ONLY FOUR (4) SEATS PER VETERAN ARE AVAILABLE FOR FAMILY MEMBER AND GUESTS. Those on the reviewing stand will be in the shade and have access to restrooms and refreshments. PLEASE MAKE YOUR RESERVATIONS TO COMMANDER GARY ZANARDI AT 628-0440 AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

Parade participants will meet at the Post at 9:30 a.m. to assemble and make final arrangements. Let's get as much participation as possible to let Youngstown know we are here and also to give the community a chance to know our veterans.
