Hard to believe that the summer is here already! There's lots going on at Trinity! My family welcomed a new child. Building projects for the air conditioning, boiler system, and lights are all under way. Soon we'll be having Vacation Bible School and filling the church with children ready to learn about God's love.

In many ways, we continue to lay the foundation so that the faith of this generation is passed down to the next. In the Epistle of 2nd Timothy we see that this passing on of faith was vital to the early church. Paul finds himself imprisoned and on trial, he fears his time of ministry will soon becoming to an end. What does he do? He spends his time pouring into Timothy, a young person who he has brought on with him as a co-worker in Christ. Paul could see that churches that he had planted were already losing their direction and being pulled away by many false teachers. In Timothy, Paul sees an opportunity to establish a new leader to keep the followers of Jesus from going astray.

"I thank God, whom I serve, as my ancestors did, with a clear conscience, as night and day I constantly remember you in my prayers. Recalling your tears, I long to see you, so that I may be filled with joy. I am reminded of your sincere faith, which first lived in your grandmother Lois and in your mother Eunice and, I am persuaded, now lives in you also."

2nd Timothy 1:3-5

Paul talks about the God his ancestor's served, who was known to Timothy's mother and grandmother. Timothy's faith journey had began generations before he was born, and now he was given the task of being a caretaker of this knowledge into the future.

Much of our mission right now at Trinity is being caretakers of the faith for the next generation. We've been blessed with many children who will need a strong church to be raised in. We have enjoyed this building for many years and now is the time to make improvements to assure it's use for another 50 years. For many in our congregation this means, quite literally, joining the work of faith began by their grandparents and parents, just as Timothy did. With sincere faith today, we focus on this mission. We go forward not just because air conditioning and heat is nice to have, not just because VBS and Sunday School are fun ways to spend our time, but because we believe in the life changing power of Jesus Christ that carries into eternity.

On call for the beginning of the meeting was Roger Sheehan.

Meeting began by reviewing building maintenance project in detail with all members and consultant, Roger Sheehan on call. The project is to include installing air conditioning, electrical update work with new lighting in sanctuary, and replacing the broken boiler system.

IPS Service from Rossford was chosen as best company to complete project based on our scope and needs with a subcontract made with Laibe Electric for all electrical work

Air conditioning includes AC installation in the sanctuary, hall, and kitchen


