Why Candles?

During the persecution of the church by the Roman Empire, Christians would take the bodies of the martyrs and bury them in the catacombs underground. The Romans were superstitious and believed the catacombs to be haunted, therefore this turned out to be a safe place to gather for worship and burying of their dead. They began lighting of the candles at the tombs of the martyrs to show support of them and in the remembrance of their sacrifice for Christ and the church. The practice continued, after the persecutions ended, it was a way of faith, to light candles for loved ones who had died, or those that were ill, or even for some other type of reason. When a candle is lit in church, it is a form of prayer and support for others in need. Votive comes from the Latin votum, meaning promise, dedication or Simply "prayer". "I am the light of the world, he who follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of Life". John 8:12. Votive candles are lit for prayer intentions. The candle symbolizes that prayer. Donations are asked, to help defray the cost of the candles. We thank you kindly for your donations.




