## Amana Heritage Society Receives Grant From Iowa County Community Foundation

The lowa County Community Foundation has made its 2024 grant awards making the announcement on July 25 at the Parnell City Hall as \$144,214 in grant funding was awarded to 18 projects by nonprofit organizations, fire districts, civic groups and cities here in lowa County.

The lowa County Community Foundation is affiliated with the Community Foundation of Northeast Iowa, a nonprofit created to serve 20 counties in northeastern Iowa. To learn more about the foundation go to cfneia.org.

The Amana Heritage Society is creating an Amana Folk Art museum in Homestead in the former Homestead General Store. The museum will showcase art created by 18th, 19th and 20th century Inspirationist-Amana artists and the creativity of Amana industrial artists who made calicos, woolens, printed work and other Amana products. Work on the building began last winter and has continued this summer with new exhibit spaces and exhibits being created in the former communal store.


