

THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC **CHURCH**

THE PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

In the *Eucharistic liturgy* the Lord's Prayer appears as the prayer of the whole Church and there reveals its full meaning and efficacy. Placed between the anaphora (the Eucharistic prayer) and the communion, the Lord's Prayer sums up on the one hand all the petitions and intercessions expressed in the movement of the epiclesis and, on the other, knocks at the door of the Banquet of the kingdom which sacramental communion anticipates.

In the Eucharist, the Lord's Prayer also reveals the eschatological character of its petitions. It is the proper prayer of "the end-time," the time of salvation that began with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and will be fulfilled with the Lord's return. The petitions addressed to our Father, as distinct from the prayers of the old covenant, rely on the mystery of salvation already accomplished, once for all, in Christ crucified and risen.

From this unshakeable faith springs forth the hope that sustains each of the seven petitions, which express the groanings of the present age, this time of patience and expectation during which "it does not yet appear what we shall be." The Eucharist and the Lord's Prayer look eagerly for the Lord's return, "until he comes."

LITURGY CORNER

THE AMICE



Definition: The amice is a rectangular linen cloth, which has two strings and is placed over the shoulders and around the neck; the strings are then tied about the waist. It has the purpose of covering the everyday clothing, even if it is the priest's clerical garb

including the modern alb, which often does not have a large opening at the neck but fits closely around the collar.

The 2008 General Instructions on the Roman Missal [GIRM] (no. 336) permits eliminating the amice if the alb is made so that it completely covers the collar, hiding the street clothes.

Scriptural Reference: The amice is understood as "the helmet of salvation," (Eph 6:17) that must protect its wearer from the demonic temptations, especially evil thoughts and desires, during the liturgical celebration. This symbolism is clearer in the custom followed by the Benedictines, Franciscans and Dominicans, who first put the amice upon their heads and then let it fall upon the chasuble or dalmatic.

Prayer: In the Roman Rite, the amice is put on before the alb. While putting it on clergy recite the following prayer: "Lord, set the helmet of salvation on my head to fend off all the assaults of the devil." (To be continued)
