Biographies

Joyce teaches Egyptology online at the University of Manchester. She has written a wide variety of academic and popular Egypt-themed books for adults & children, including books to accompany the television series Private Lives of the Pharaohs, Egypt's Golden Empire and Egypt. In January 2008 her book Cleopatra: Last Queen of Egypt, was the Book of the Week on BBC Radio 4. Her book Tutankhamen's Curse was awarded the 2014 Felicia A. Holton Book Award by the Archaeological Institute of America.

Steven has taught undergraduate and postgraduate students at the University of Liverpool since 1994. He has extensive fieldwork experience in Egypt and has directed several archaeological excavations at sites including the Eastern Delta, Abydos, and the ongoing work at the Ramesside fortress of Zawiyet Umm el-Rakham. His current research focus is on the sacred landscape of ancient Egypt.
