Get Ready! A disaster survival program for Marin

"Get Ready! Is a disaster preparedness program specifically designed for residents of Marin County. With simple, two hour classes tailored to the individual communities in Marin, your local fire agency will help you and your family prepare for the inevitable disasters that will strike in and around Marin." You have probably noticed the yellow signs posted by the roadsides throughout the county. Hopefully you have already taken the class at our local fire station and are on your way to implementing a disaster plan for your household.

If you have not had the chance, consider signing up for one of the last courses to be offered at the Throckmorton Ridge Fire Station---TUESDAY FEBRUARY 26th at 7pm and SATURDAY MARCH 29th at 1 pm. The presentation is a concise primer on the basic things one can do to be prepared for the variety of problems that arise during a disaster. After the recent power outage due to high winds and bad weather, we are reminded of how important it is to be ready for the loss of power, water, gas and transportation that will accompany a major disaster.

The course helps you to develop a household plan that covers all situations---being at home, at work or in the car on the highway. It encourages you to be able to take care of yourself and your family at a time when emergency services will be under severe strain. The manual and course is also available online along with a home supply checklist and a car supply checklist. The Alert Siren is in the county's hands and will soon be up and operating. Costs of the siren repairs are the county's. They will also educate us for proper maintenance. Further service costs will be ours.

The AM radio package is being installed at the Fire Station. Cost is the county's and is being handled by OES.

We've tested the "TENS" phone system, and while there will be more tests needed, I feel the system will work. We'll test it again when the siren is operating. One new communication item the county is installing is a new email / computer system giving us another alerting device. The county will advise us as they proceed, and you will be updated.

The county "Get Ready" classes and educational program announcements will be passed on to you as received. See the article in the left-hand column for details.

Finally, our committee will meet soon and discuss the Safety Container subject. Location, budget, appearance, contents, funding sources, etc., will be reviewed and recommendations will be made to the board.

Spring Days in Muir Woods

Abundant rain is just what makes a redwood forest happy! Early January windstorms did their natural pruning, the creeks are full of water and the delicate color of early wildflowers dot the forest floor. A perfect backdrop for the park's Centennial activities. They have ranged from celebrations full of walks, birthday cake, poetry and restoration work plus the serious business of being declared a Historic Place on the National Register for its role in the history of American Conservation AND many proclamations in Congress, the state Assembly and by the Marin County Board of Supervisors. Much more ahead! Books will be published later this spring, a "natural quiet zone" declared in Cathedral Grove on UN Day, May 19 and finally the trees will be measured!

But there is distressing news, too. For the first time, salmon did not return to spawn. This endangered species was just a step from disaster already but scientists think the New Year's Eve '05 floods washed out precious eggs and later young fish could not find food in the ocean. Keep your fingers crossed that maybe a few slipped up to continue this year's class.

We'll soon be watching and listening for another endangered species: the northern spotted owl. For many years two pairs have nested here and hopefully will be seen this year. Life is challenging for them, too, since the much more aggressive barred owl has now moved into their territory! Look for an update in the next issue.

This is a great time to walk in Muir Woods. Soon park hours will be extended to 8 pm: perfect for an after work twilight walk! Enjoy the freshness of spring without the crowds!
