

Exploring artistry at StoneGate

Vercii's Studio will Vercii Reed offer an introductory 16week course, Community Art I, Thursdays from 7-10 p.m., Jan. 12 through May 4, 2017, with a week off for spring break.

Community Art I will explore art in the community and is a comprehensive introduction to a variety of different artistic media, including drawing, painting and sculpture. The course is open to anyone 16 years old and older.
