



### RECYCLING IS GREEN, SAVES GREEN

Charles Link knows garbage. As Director of Engineering, Link used his expertise to develop a successful food waste recycling program at Hyatt Regency Princeton that has spread to other Hyatt Hotels in New Jersey. His efforts were highlighted in the November 2010 issue of the prominent industry magazine, *BioCycle*.

In December 2007, Link attended a food waste recycling forum hosted by Rutgers University where he learned about the Food and Organics Recycling for New Jersey (FOR NJ) Certification Process. "I learned about the opportunity for the hotel to recycle food waste, and ways of enhancing our already established programs," says Link, a member of the hotel's "Green Team" of staff that train fellow employees on recycling procedures and look for new recycling, reduction and reuse opportunities.

In January 2009, the Hyatt Regency Princeton became the first business in New Jersey to receive certification. To receive FOR NJ certification, the hotel had to complete these tasks: conduct a waste and a purchasing audit; become a partner of the U.S. EPA's WasteWise Program

and a member of FOR NJ; contract with a hauler to collect the hotel's food waste; and host a WasteShed forum.



Although the hotel, which has 347 guestrooms, had already been recycling office paper, newspapers, magazines, cans, bottles, plastic, glass, aluminum and steel for several years, the food waste recycling program began in October 2008. Staff were trained on what was to be composted and recycled. As a result, Hyatt Regency Princeton saved more than \$13,000 in 2009 by composting food waste and recycling, proving that recycling programs can save some green as well as the environment.

About 21 tons of commingled recyclables (cans, bottles, glass, plastic, steel, aluminum, paper and cardboard) were recycled and more than 131 tons of food waste were collected at the hotel and composted in 2009. Hyatt Regency Princeton also recycles several other items. Used cooking grease is sold to a company that recycles it in animal feed. Worn linens are used as rags by hotel staff. Used computer equipment is donated to nonprofits or sent for environmentally safe recycling/disposal. Empty toner cartridges, batteries, light bulbs and light ballasts are returned for recycling.

Link hosted a WasteShed forum in January 2009 that had 69 attendees that included educators, state and local officials and other Hyatt Hotels in New Jersey. "At the forum, I shared our success story," he says. As a result, the Hyatt hotels in New Brunswick, Jersey City and Morristown began their own food waste collection programs.



## THE TASTE OF HYATT

### FARFALLE WITH GRILLED CHICKEN AND PORTABELLA MUSHROOMS

- 4 fresh chicken breasts, 4-6 ounces each
- 8 ounces Italian salad dressing
- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 2 shallots, minced
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 4 medium to large portabella mushrooms, brushed clean, sliced in half then sliced into strips; stems can also be sliced (discarding the root)
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley
- 1 tablespoons chopped fresh tarragon
- 1 pint heavy cream
- 1 pound Farfalle pasta
- 1 ounce fresh Parmesan cheese
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Grated Parmesan cheese, to taste
- Chopped parsley



Marinate the chicken breast in the Italian dressing for 4 to 6 hours. To make the sauce, using a 4-quart sauce pot over medium heat add 3 tablespoons good olive oil, shallots and garlic. Cook over medium heat 4 to 6 minutes then turn the heat to medium high. Add the portabellas, parsley and tarragon. Cook until the mushrooms are tender, stirring as needed. Add the heavy cream and bring to a boil, then reduce to a slow boil to reduce the cream until it is slightly thickened. Keep the sauce warm until ready to use. Grill the chicken to 165 degrees F, then let them sit 5 to 10 minutes. Cut the chicken into strips. Cook the pasta according to the manufacturers directions, drain then toss with the grilled chicken and the portabella sauce. Add the grated Parmesan and season with salt and pepper to taste. Garnish with fresh parsley and more Parmesan. Serves 4.
