Now that the Scottsdale City Council is back in session, I would like to show you a few reasons why local elections matter. I know we get caught up in the Presidential election, but the Electoral College will be the ones to decide that. Who decides what happens in your own hometown?

You have probably heard of the Desert Discovery Center, or DDC. A special interest group that has decided we need to exploit our Preserve by building a commercial venture disguised as a tourist attraction. But besides the DDC, did you

hear about the sign tower up north? 25' high along our scenic corridor on Scottsdale Road? Of course that probably won't be as bad as the bright Texaco Star on the new gas station at Pima & Dynamite!

How about the residents of Rio Verde having to pay more for water hauling because Scottsdale National has effectively closed down their hydrant at the golf entrance? What about the Gentleman's Club on FLW and the 101? Then there is the mega-multi-use project on 64th & McDowell that has residents up in arms. Lets not forget the 90' tower going up at Skysong on the SE corner of McDowell and Scottsdale Rd, across from Virginia Korte's property. This is not to be confused with the six story, 325 Bolshevik-inspired concrete slab apartments on Hayden and Northsight, only 1000 yards from the airport runway. Or the 3x density project slated for 92nd and Cactus. Be aware of the canal project along 79th and Chaparral which is violating every county code for dust, noise and hours of operation.

Oh yes, there is also the four story office/apartments in our Scottsdale mall, courtesy of my new opponent and his friends, Councilwomen Korte and Milhaven. Do you think the LGBTQ ordinance is gone? How about light rail? Both are only a election away from reality.

You may think that Pickleball courts without rotating paddle racks is more important (an actual issue right now) but let's not forget others like Mosquito Lake, a flood runoff basin to protect the CAP which in recent times has become a Zika test basin. Let's not forget the stadium lights from Notre Dame Prep keeping residents of Windgate up at night while hazing the summer night skies. And recently, we found out that a fire station the voters approved in the last bond vote will be built be taking land through eminent domain. I don't think that was in the bond question!

These are all coming up on our Council agendas. Marijuana dispensaries near schools, Air B&B turning neighborhoods into youth hostels, Sober Homes across the street, Federal and State laws superceding local ordinances......

In opening, District Chairman Jim O'Connor welcomed everyone and thanked them for their attendance. Jim announced that Alex Meluskey has suspended his campaign.

Jim suggested that the following candidates need our help doing phone calls.
