Books

The Soul of a New Machine - Kidder

3 of 5 Stars

While I spend much of my day relying upon it's offspring, I know next to nothing about the advent of the computer. Kidder's book is a Pulitzer winning, non-fiction work on a heretofore (to me) unknown segment of this history. Less about the machine than the minds and the atmosphere that created it, this reads a lot like a fiction book and is (I think) the precursor to AMC's underrated series *Halt and Catch Fire*. (As the only series I know that spans the 80's and 90's so well and shifts premise and character emphasis so easily in its second season, and is recommended.)

The Keeper of Lost Causes – Adler-Olsen

3 of 5 Stars

Sorry, but, especially when I just want to read for fun, I really do read quite a bit of Nordic noir. Apparently this is the first in a series – Nordic noir always seems to come in series – and I will probably read more. If not this one, you really should try out this genre sometime – Stieg Larson, Jo Nesbo, Henning Mankell, Vidar Sundstol, or Adler-Olsen, they really are easy entertainment. 'Nordic' and 'noir' go together like their alliterative names make you feel like they should.

The Crying of Lot 49-Pynchon

2 of 5 Stars

Considered the most accessible Pynchon (and probably the shortest), this book is the inspiration for AMC's underrated series Lodge 49 (see a theme here?). This one is about the main character's descent into a rabbit hole of causality created by her own paranoia and the idea is, I think, that one is supposed to question what's real, what's predestined, or what's just coincidence, the result of someone messing with us, or is self fulfilled. I can't say I connected as much with this, but Pynchon definitely has postmodern life pegged and is more of an experience than a novel.

Pygmy – Palahniuk 3 of 5 Stars

Written completely in its own dialect (that of a young 'terrorist' who is quite-tongue-in-cheek-ily sent to America to wreak havoc, who does so in quite a few accidental ways, but who – spoiler alert - ultimately embraces all that he was critiquing) this book – like so much of Palahniuk – is brutal and savage satire. It is also not for the faint of heart (some of the things depicted are graphic), but boy is it spot on scary/funny stuff about American culture and its effects.

Holy Things — Lathrop

3.5 of 5 Stars

The liturgy of the church is, to me, like a new medium and one that I love to consider, practice, and grow in. This book addressed a lot of what it means to be a Lutheran in worship, some history of the liturgy, and what the purpose of this medium is – worship, a drawing into font and table, and a purposeful repose between sacred and holy, Sunday and the rest of the week, heaven and earth, and already and not yet.

Movie

El Camino – Netflix

4.5 of 5 Stars

Theme alert: if AMC's can't-be-overrated enough show *Breaking Bad* (which is my favorite series of all time) is about the moral descent of middle America in the name of selfishness masked as concern, then *El Camino* is about the moral ascent of sidekick and poorly mentored burnout Jesse Pinkman. It has a lot of call backs to the series, but doesn't necessarily pander to it. It is a modern western – complete with shootout. And it plays around with the consequences of choice, how evil can be prosperously hidden in plain sight while the nearly-good struggle to overcome, and redemption. This is the perfect movie for streaming instead of theaters and is as well done as *Breaking Bad*. Can one skew good after being coaxed into breaking bad?






