I attended the VACDCE National Advisory Committee Executive Committee (NAC) meeting on October 12th-13th at the DAV National Service and Legislative Headquarters in Washington, DC. The NAC meets twice annually with full committee gathering in the spring, and the executive committee meeting in the fall.

Many topics were discussed including the PACT Act, veteran access to voting, volunteer reintegration, and the compassionate contact corps.

The PACT Act information was presented by the Senior Advisor for Strategic Engagement. The complete name of the act is The Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring Our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics Act. If you are a veteran and were, or may have been, exposed to toxic materials, apply as soon as possible, <u>even</u> if you have previously applied and been denied. If you or any veteran are unable to exercise the right to vote, go to <u>https://www.va.gov/initiatives/vote/.</u>

Military Women Across the Nation \$1,000 College Scholarship Rules & Application



The 2023 essay topic is

"<u>What Were the Challenges Faced by Military Women</u> <u>Who Served in Vietnam During the Vietnam War?</u>"

APPLICANTS WHO DO NOT ADHERE TO <u>ALL INSTRUCTIONS</u> WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.

Applicant Eligibility

- 1. Must have a 3.2 or better Grade Point Average (GPA) on a 4.0 scale.
- 2. Must be a high school senior or undergraduate college student.
- 3. Entries must be submitted by 1 April 2023: NO EXCEPTIONS.

4. Military women and veterans MAY NOT APPLY FOR THIS SCHOLARSHIP.

Application Package MUST INCLUDE the following:

1. Completed Application.

2. Copy of all transcripts pertaining to current course of study to include academic standing.

NOTE: To protect personal information applicants are directed to mark out all references to social security numbers on high school or college transcripts.

3. An essay of 1,000 to 1,500 words in length written on the above topic. The essay must be the applicant's own work; be submitted in .doc or .docx format, and include documented evidence (including a bibliography) of both research and <u>an interview with at least one military woman</u>. Applicants are encouraged to contact military women in recruiting offices, at military bases, reserve units, etc. to enhance the research.

4. The entire Application Package shall be submitted in one email to include **separate attachments** for the following:

- (1) Completed Application
- (2) Transcripts (must be legible)
- (3) Applicant's essay (in .doc or .docx format)

Each attached file must include the applicant's last name and first initial as part of the file name and ALL correspondence must include the applicant's name in the subject line.

Application Package Submission DEADLINE is 1 April 2023.

Applicants will be notified in June 2023 of the results.

The scholarship will be paid jointly to the scholarship recipient AND his/her college.

The critical importance of early detection

October was Breast Cancer Awareness Month, a perfect time for a reminder about the importance of mammograms and early detection. Those with localized breast cancer have a 99% survival rate if detected early, and the VA leads the nation's health care systems in providing mammograms to those who need them.

"Early detection and treatment are key in the fight against breast cancer," said Debra Pierce-Robinson, Women Veterans Program Manager at G.V. Montgomery VAMC in Jackson, MS. "Our Women Veterans Program emphasizes the importance of expanding access to on-site mammograms, ensuring veterans receive age-appropriate breast cancer screenings. We are using state-of-the-art information technology to meet the growing needs of women veterans."

For women ages 45 and older, VA recommends regular breast cancer screening. Women may also choose to start screening with yearly mammograms as early as age 40.

Breast care resources available through VA include mammograms, breast ultrasounds and MRI, genetic counseling and testing, cancer diagnosis, treatment and more.

The VA encourages women veterans not currently using VA health care services to enroll and use the benefits they have earned. Call the Women Veterans Call Center for information at 1-855-VA-Women (1-855-829-6636) or visit womenshealth.va.gov.

In 2020, the Compassionate Contact Corps was started in Ohio. These volunteers provide remote support to veterans and their caregivers. If you are looking for a way to volunteer that allows you to set your own hours and that can be done remotely, this is it. The training is also done on online. Employment

AARP and Blue Star Families have teamed up to help women veterans, military spouses find employment

Underemployment - when your employment does not match your desires, education or experience - affects 63 percent of military spouses, and, as the population of women veterans grows, challenges continue to arise as they look for a civilian job.



"When you're a veteran or military spouse, it can be challenging to know where to start your job search and how to get employers to understand how your job skills and military experience relate to a new position," said Troy Broussard, senior adviser of the AARP Veterans and Military Families Initiative and Army veteran. "That's why we teamed up with Blue Star Families to help female veterans and military spouses learn how to effectively leverage their military backgrounds to give them an edge in today's competitive job market."

"Military spouses and female veterans are looking for opportunities to make networking connections and receive help in preparing for job interviews," said Blue Star Families CEO Kathy Roth-Douquet. "During {a virtual town hall meeting featuring job search tips and resources}, one attendee commented, 'Thank you for connecting everyone! My LinkedIn is blowing up, and I love it!'"


