

READING: Ecclesiastes 3:1-11

¹For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven:

²a time to be born, and a time to die;

a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted;

³a time to kill, and a time to heal;

a time to break down, and a time to build up;

⁴a time to weep, and a time to laugh;

a time to mourn, and a time to dance;

⁵a time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together;

a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing;

⁶a time to seek, and a time to lose;

a time to keep, and a time to throw away;

⁷a time to tear, and a time to sew;

a time to keep silence, and a time to speak;

⁸a time to love, and a time to hate;

a time for war, and a time for peace.

⁹What gain have the workers from their toil? ¹⁰I have seen the business that God has given to everyone to be busy with. ¹¹He has made everything suitable for its time; moreover he has put a sense of past and future into their minds, yet they cannot find out what God has done from the beginning to the end.

GOSPEL READING: John 2:1-12

¹On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. ²Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. ³When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." ⁴And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." ⁵His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." 6Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. ⁷Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. ⁸He said to them. "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. 9When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom ¹⁰ and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." 11 Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him. ¹²After this he went down to Capernaum with his mother, his brothers, and his disciples; and they remained there a few days.

Kamal Wati Narayan was born in a lovely village of Lomawai, Nadroga in the paradise island of Fiji. Her parents were Latchni and Sita Ram. She was sweet, as she was raised on a sugarcane farm. Calm and cool, Kamla was the youngest sibling of seven. She had 4 brothers, Ram Narayan, Ram Karan, Jai Narayan and Deo Sharan, and two sisters, Ram Dulari and Ram Pyari.

Kamla was married to Hari Narayan on April 18th, 1959. They settled in Suva City, which is the capital of Fiji. Together they raised their five children-three sons and two daughters- Rohesh Chandra(Jimmy), Rakesh Narayan, Shyam Duber, Sailesh Narayan and Surya Skjonsby. Manju Narayan, Ravi Duber, Shalini Narayan and Johannes Skjonsby joined the family through marriage and were dear to her.

Her future legacy bearers are her grandchildren-Akash, Warsha, Kaushik, Rajen, Scotrick, Karishma and Beorn. She was also blessed as a great-grandmother. Her love for her nieces and nephews and greater Narayan clan was larger than the Pacific Ocean. Kamla lived for her family.
