

Here Is One Group of Stars That Should Be Thankful; Scientist Leaves \$15,000 for Their Care

ANN ARBOR, Mich., Nov. 14. A one little family of stars, James Craig Watson's asteroids, is still wealthy after the use of a \$15,000 bequest for 60 years.

Watson, then director of the University of Michigan observatory, died in 1880. Having fulfilled for 20 years, among other duties, in the discovery of 21 small planets, he left the money for their care, which in astronomy meant finding out more about them.

Goebbels Issues Ten-Point Edict Against Jews

Berlin, Nov. 14. Ten new points governing Germans in their relations with Jews, issued by Goebbels, minister of propaganda, were published today in the periodical, Das Reich.

They followed thorough-going anti-Jewish action throughout Germany and the transfer of many Jews from Berlin and other parts of Germany to territory in the East during recent weeks.

It was not specified to what section the Jews were being taken—perhaps to Poland or German-occupied Western Russia—but earlier word from Germany indicated they were being moved in thousands.

The attitude toward Jews as outlined by Dr. Goebbels was: 1—Jews started this war; they want to destroy Germany.

Mrs. Louisa Noble, Pioneer Dallas Woman, Succumbs

Fort Worth, Tex., Nov. 14. Mrs. Louisa Noble, 83, granddaughter of Mrs. Mabel Gilbert, the first white woman to go to Dallas, died early Friday morning at her residence here where she had been nursing her sister, Mrs. Harold Gooch, had lived together for a quarter of a century. She had been ill several months.

Churchill Is Asked To Speak to Banquet In U. S. by Telephone

New York, Nov. 14. Prime Minister Winston Churchill was asked today by the National Association of Manufacturers to be the principal speaker Dec. 5 at the banquet closing its annual convention.

The speech would be via telephone from No. 10 Downing Street to 3009 or more American industrialists, cabinet members and government officials grouped in the Waldorf Astoria Hotel before a loudspeaker set on an otherwise empty rostrum.
